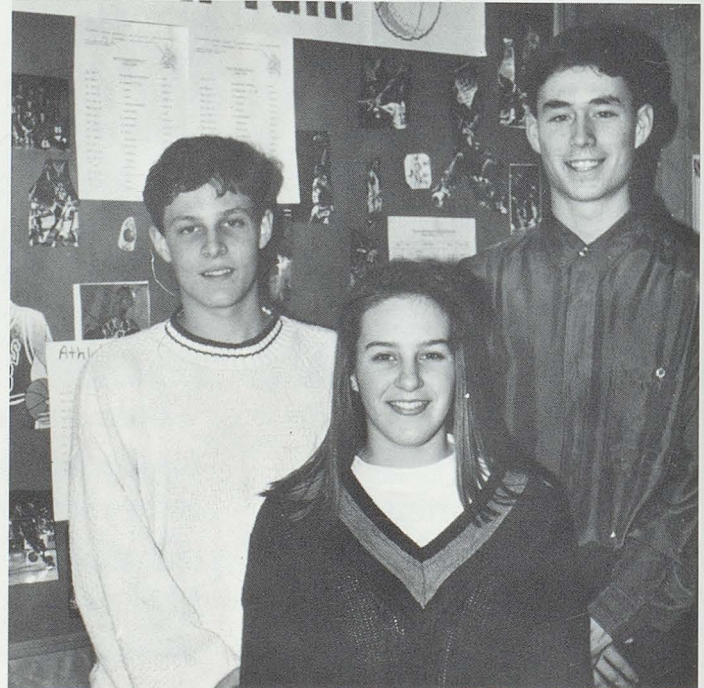

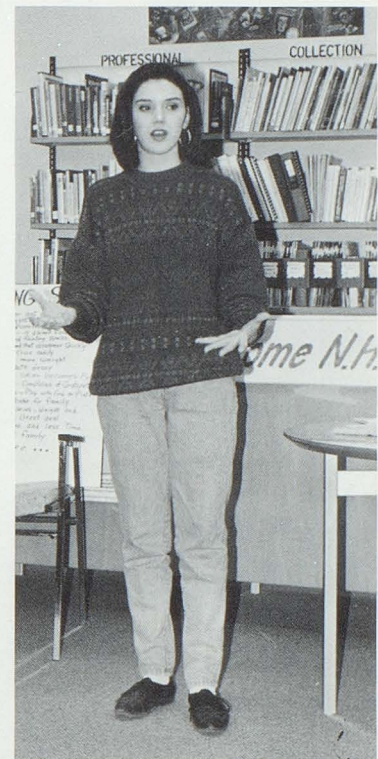

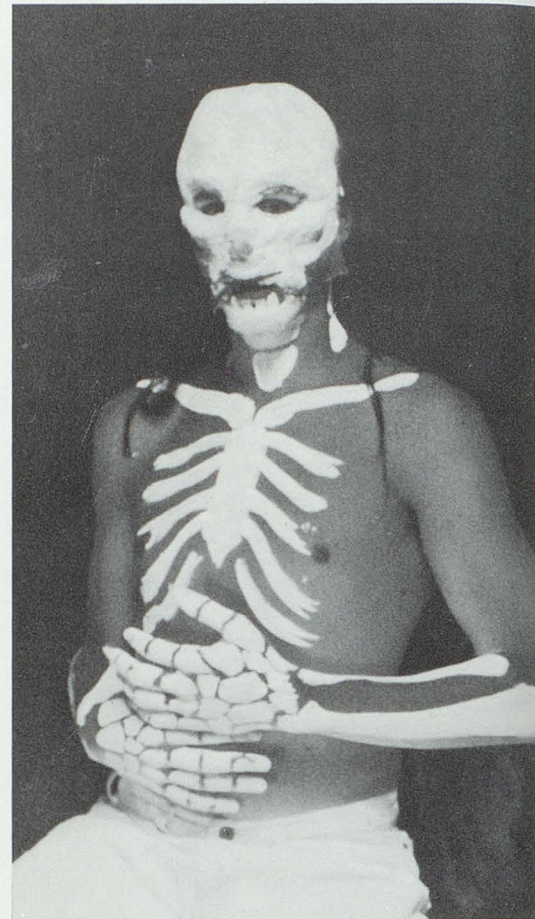

Lastly was the production of "Nan's Diner" an intergalactic extra-terrestrial thriller which portrayed the interaction between earthlings and aliens.

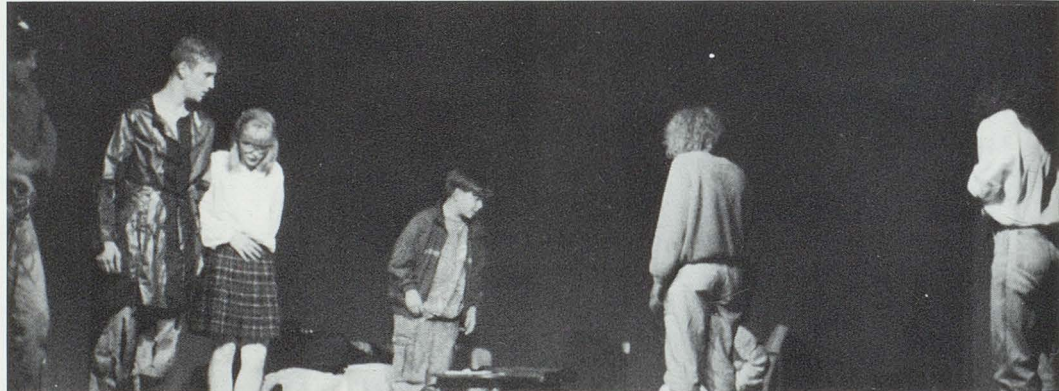

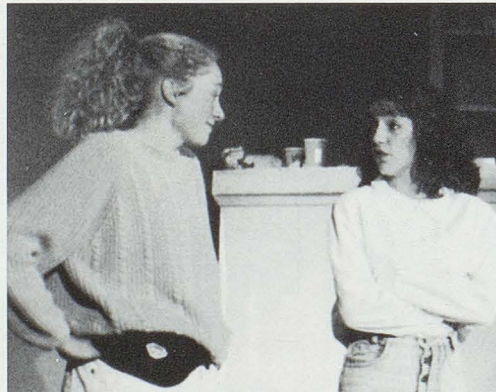

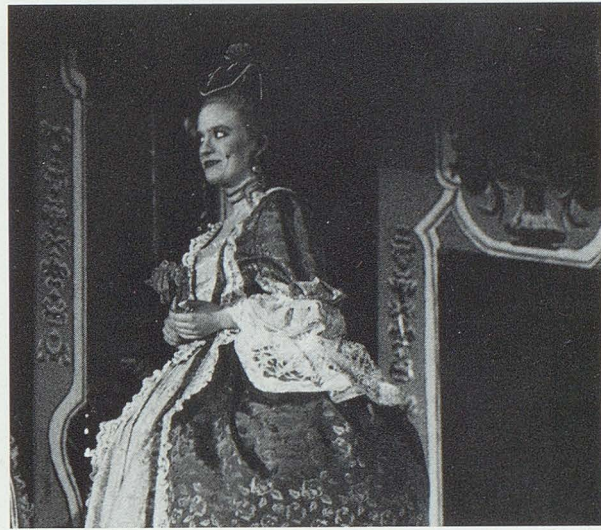

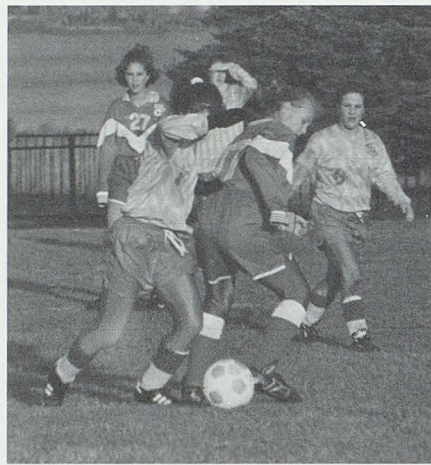

# BOY'S VARSITY SOCCER

This year proved to be a most exciting and successful year for Coach Aldrete's varsity squad. The soccer team's talent, aggressive play, and desire to win earned them a place in the Eastern Maine Semifinals.

The varsity team hadn't gone beyond the first round playoffs since 1984. This year, they knocked off a higher seeded Central Aroostook High School team to gain the spot in the semifinals. Unfortunately, they lost a hard-fought game to number one ranked

Katahdin High School.

We outscored opponents in all games 60 goals to 23 goals this year. This was due to an explosive offense and a strong and hard-hitting defense. A lot of teams thought very highly of our skills this year. Both Caribou, a class A team, and Fort Kent, a class B team, requested that we scrimmage them for preparation to the playoffs. We certainly earned respect as a team.

Our desire to win as a team brought forth emo-

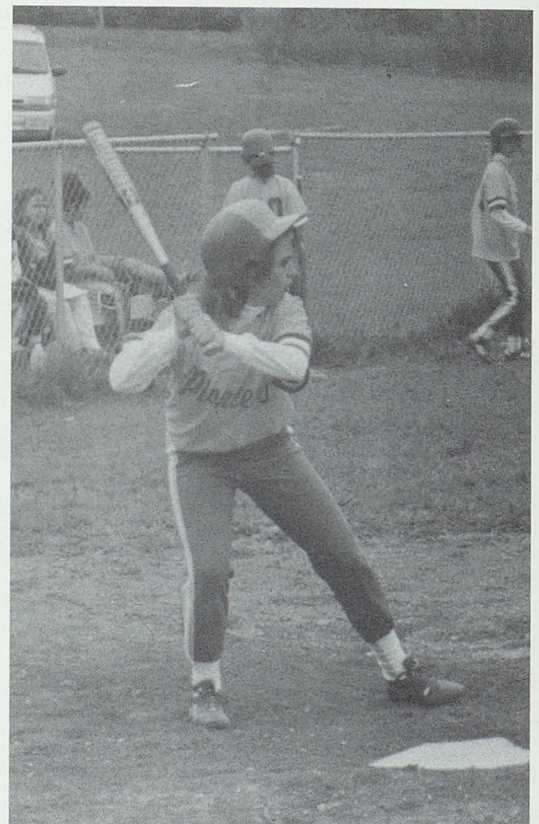
## A very challenging year for the Pioneer Softballers

With this in mind, they know that next year, if they cut down on errors, they could compete well with anyone they play.



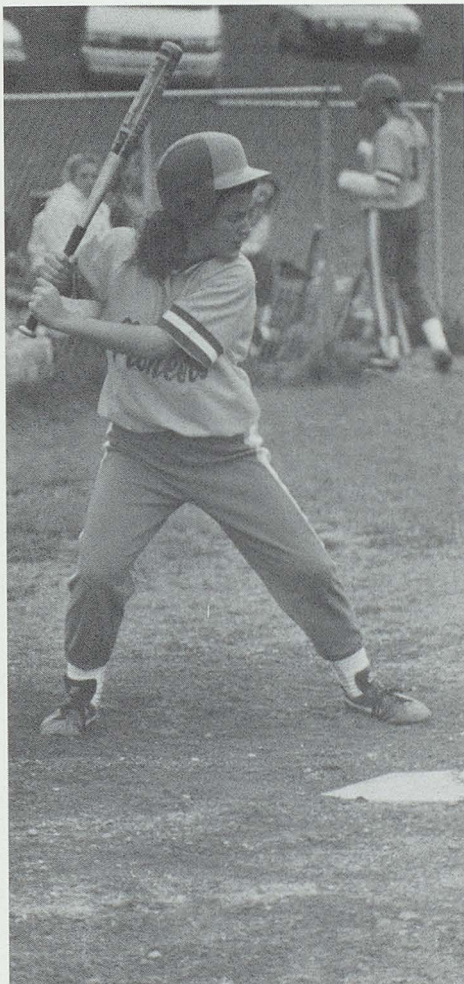
