like just yesterday I began school! I just can't see myself on my own."

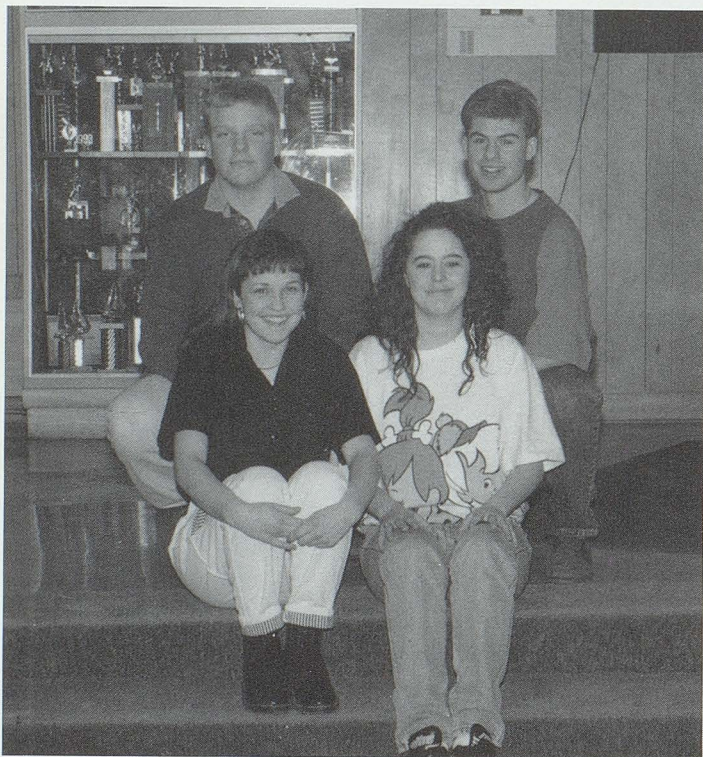
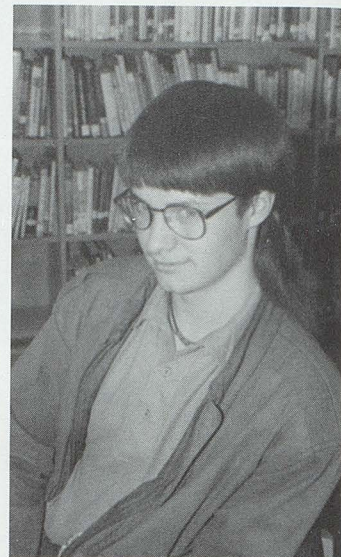

Here is even more evidence that these sophomores really fit in and feel comfortable. Kevin Gagnon

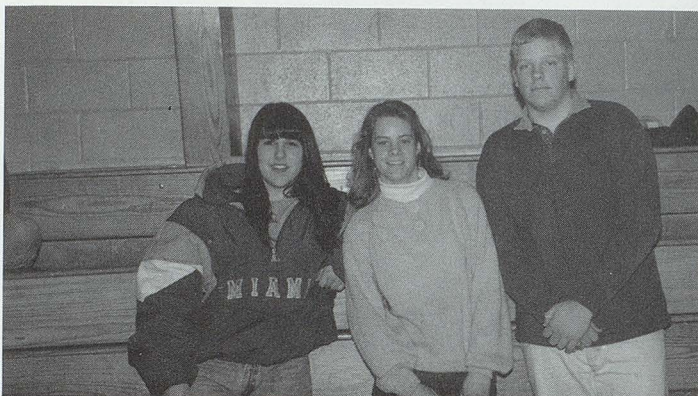
gave us some insight on his class as a group. "Our class has really diversified. I feel we've split up into certain groups, rather than socializing all together, but I still feel we all respect one another."

Who's the smallest class at Wisdom High School? It's the class of 1997, which consists

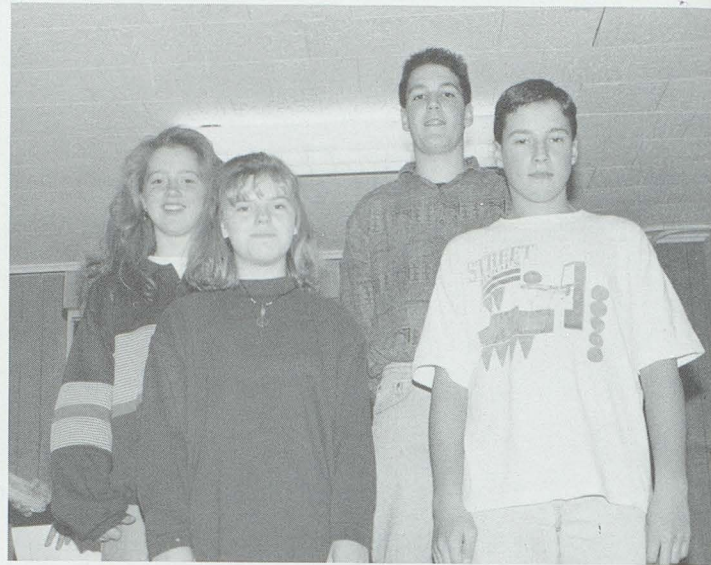

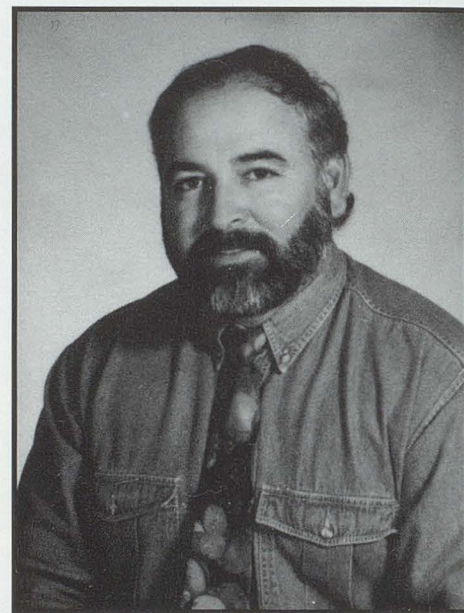
MR. GERRY MORIN

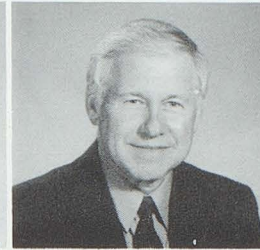
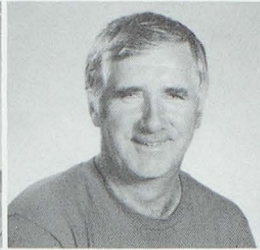
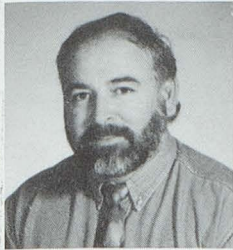
MR. JOEL PALMER

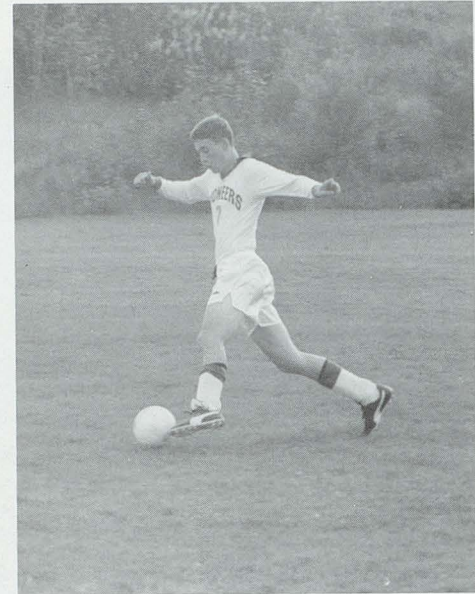
What motivates these guys

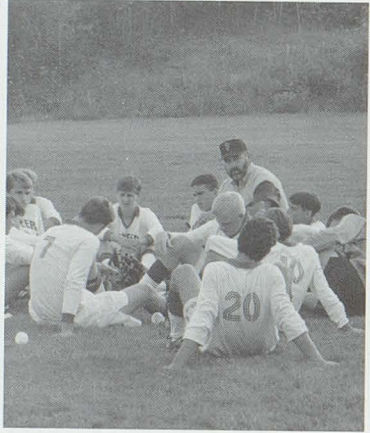
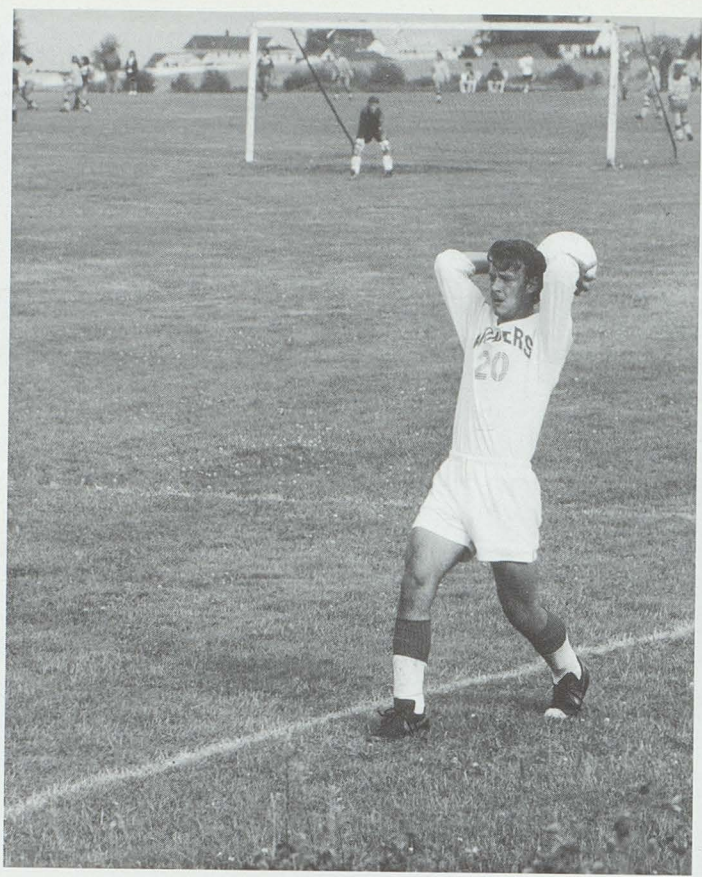

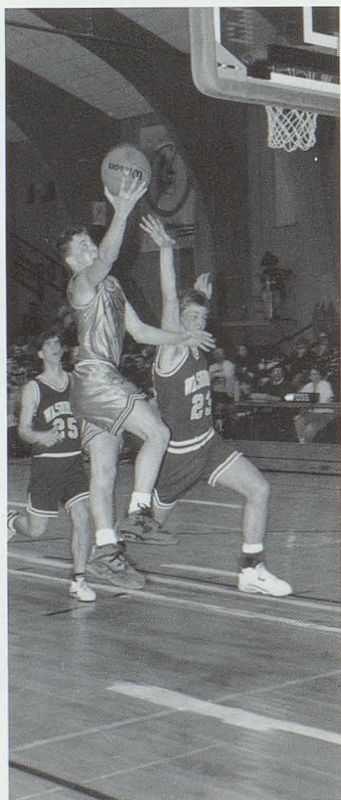

A Team Effort

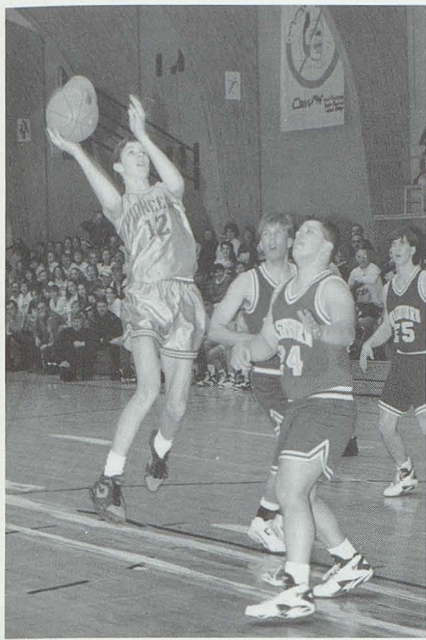

thought in my mind throughout the season, and this is what motivated me to give 100 percent effort", stated senior forward Michelle Paradis.

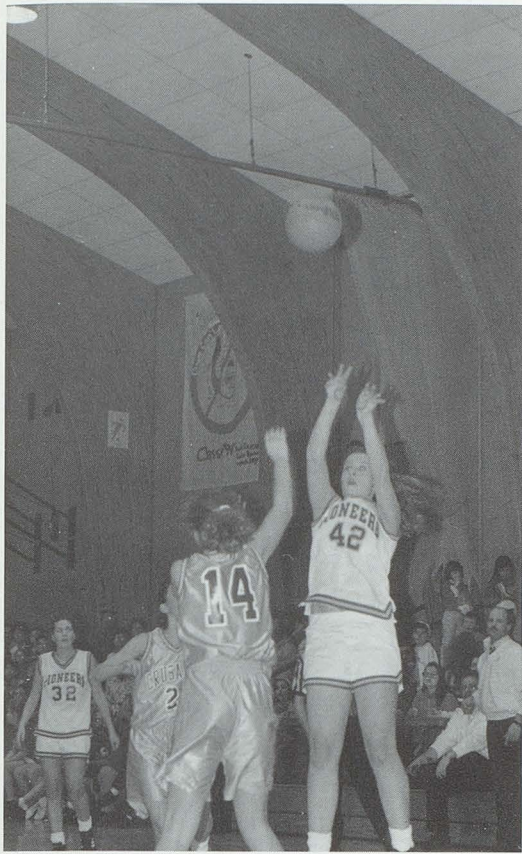

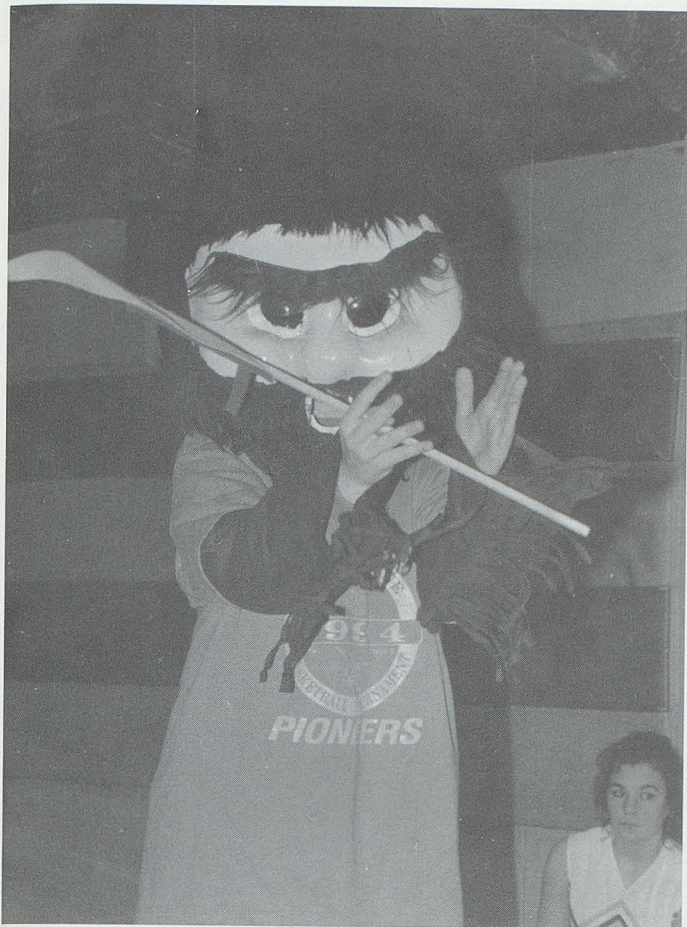

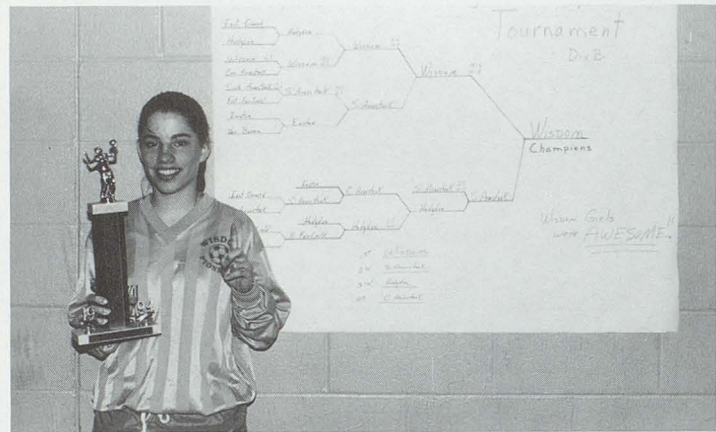

To get the butterflies out of their stomachs the boys psych themselves up by talking about the starting line-ups and the strategies they will use.

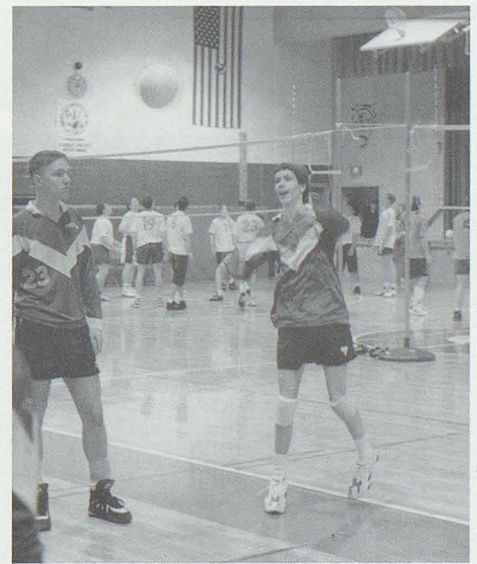
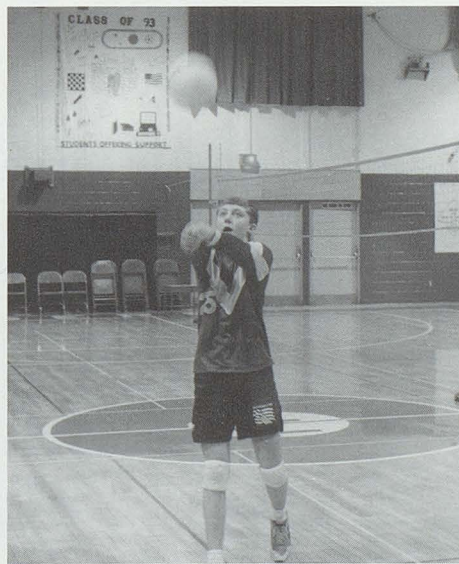

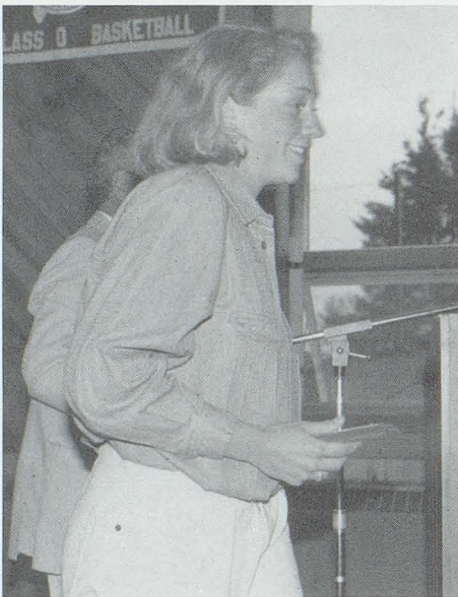

First Game Victory

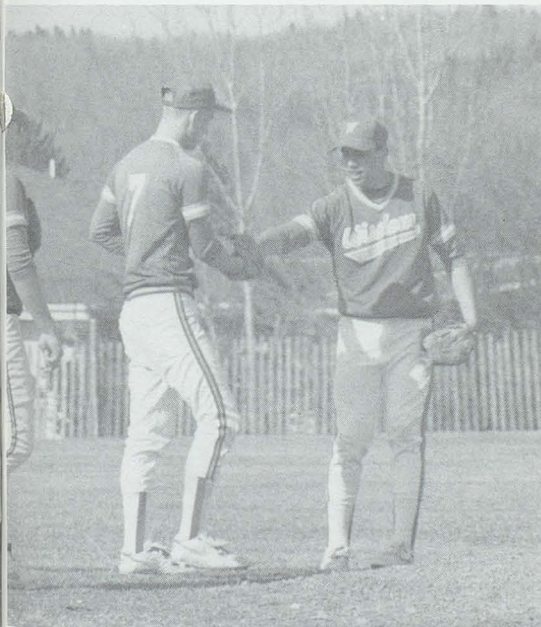

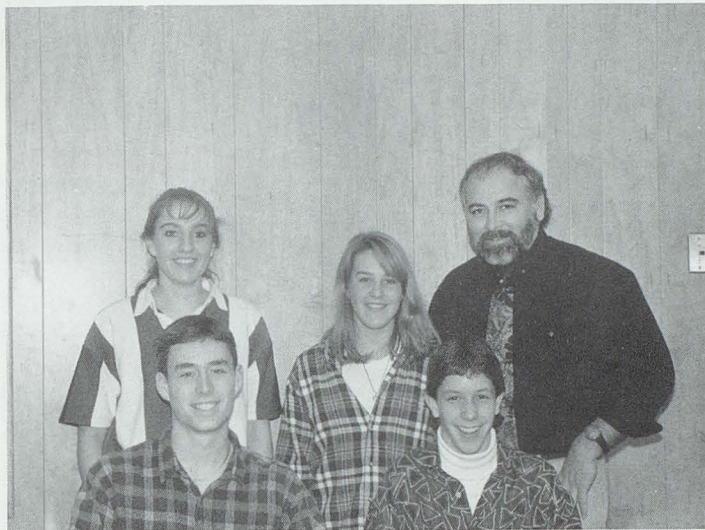






Cold Water Affair
