At this year's pep rally

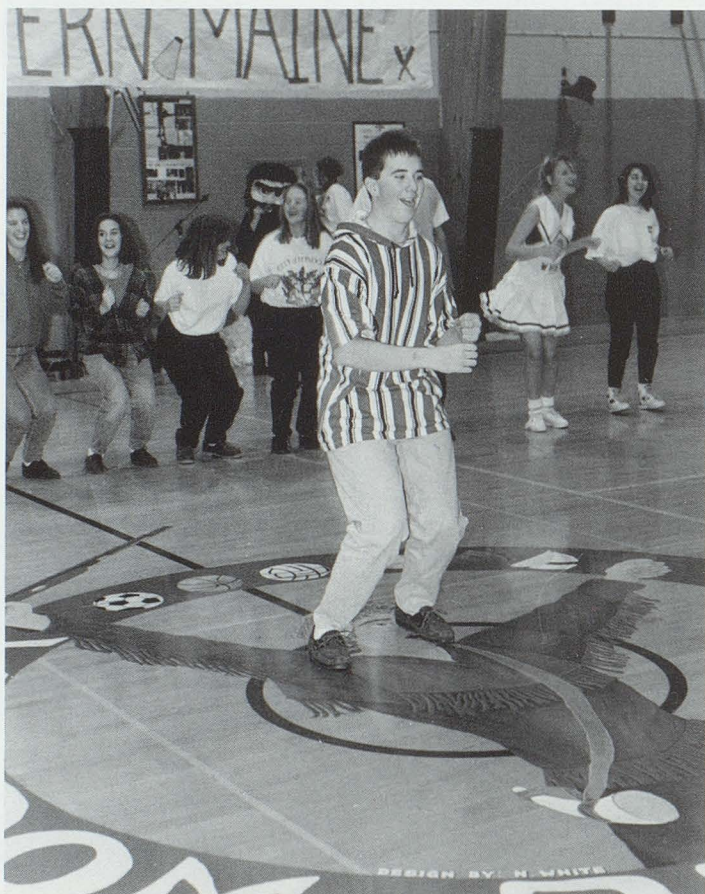
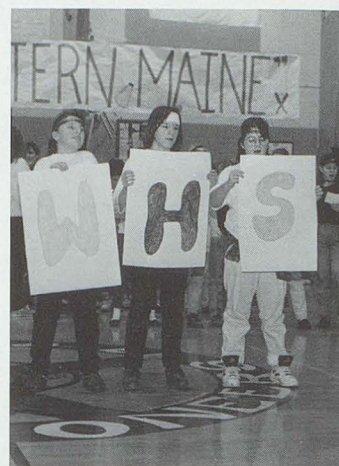

Become a Peer Educator. It's a great way to help things happen in school.

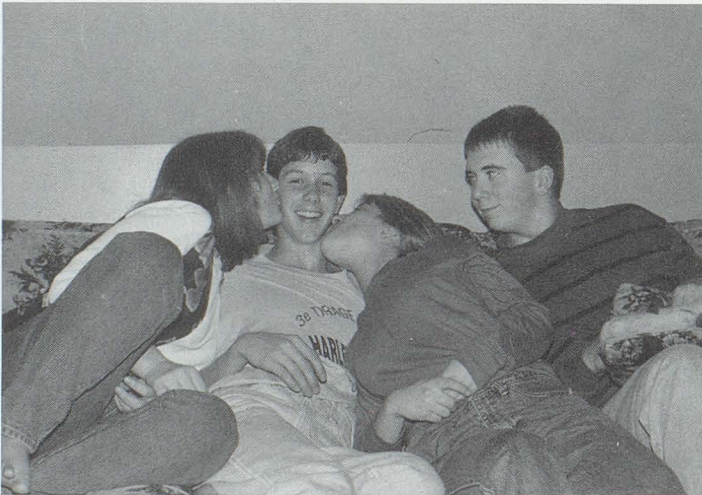

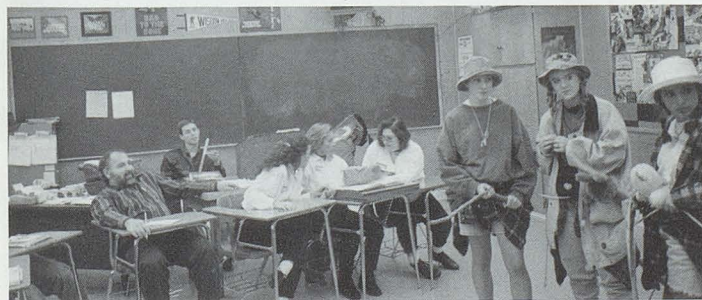
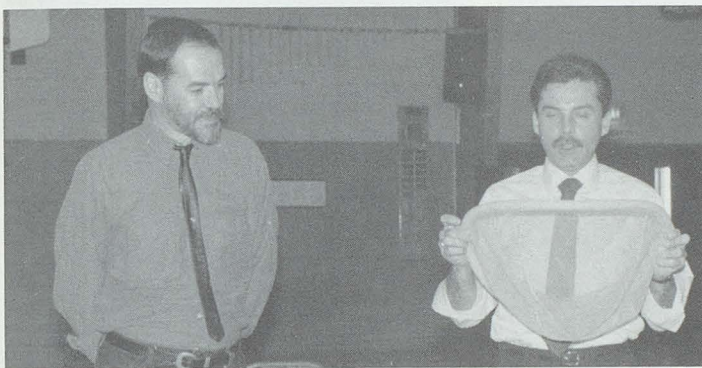
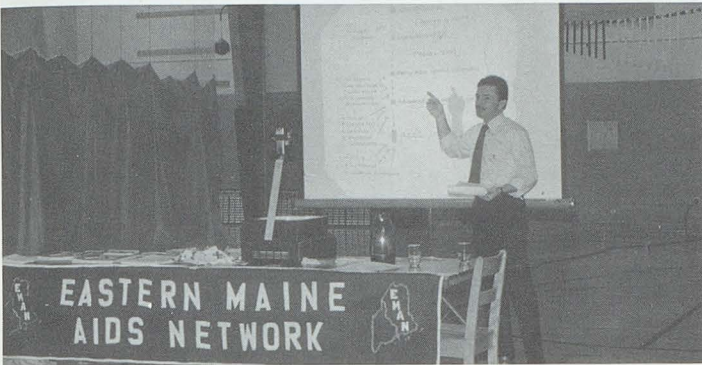
# Living With AIDS

It was a first! On October 29, 1993 in our Wisdom High School Gymnasium we experienced our first ever educational AIDS Conference. Dennis Cranston, from the Eastern Maine Aids Network, gave a presentation to grades 7-12. He talked about how one can acquire HIV. Blood transfusions, promiscuous sex, multiple sex partners, and unprotected sex are the main transmission modes for the HIV virus. The virus effects our T-cells. He explained that everyone has T-cells and these fight off disease. The HIV virus attacks these cells and

takes them over until there are no more left to fight disease. That's when you get Acquired Immune Deficiency Syndrome (AIDS).

Paul Camery, who is HIV positive, talked to the students about what it's like to live with HIV. He told us about himself and how he copes with his disease. Basically, you try to live as normal a life as possible. Camery also talked about how the students have so much going for them and not to throw that away. A healthy life is very precious.

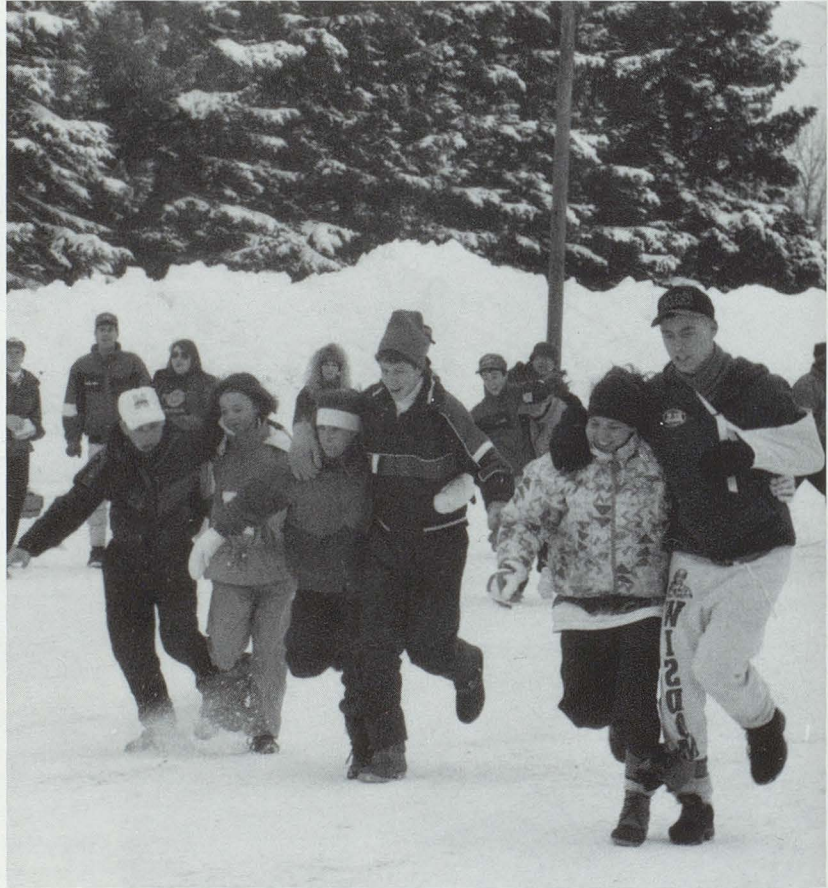
the Potato Sack Race.

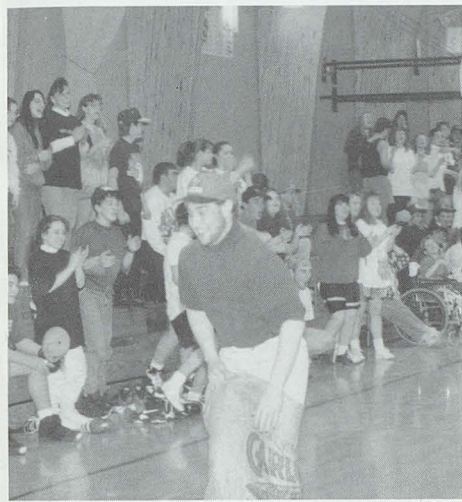
The Freshmen girls took first in Marble and Spoon Relay and Nintendo while the boys took first in Table Tennis and Nintendo.

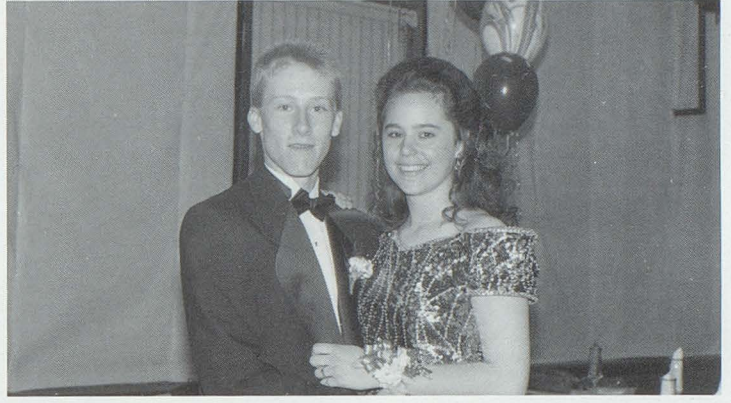
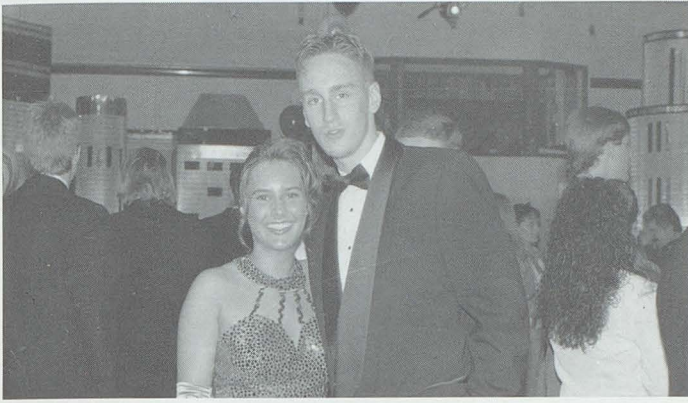
## We've Got Tonight

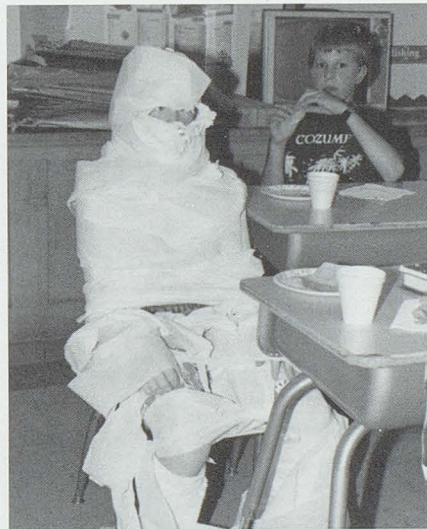
## ARBOR FORCE

By the way, Jupiter has 16 moons and Saturn has 23!

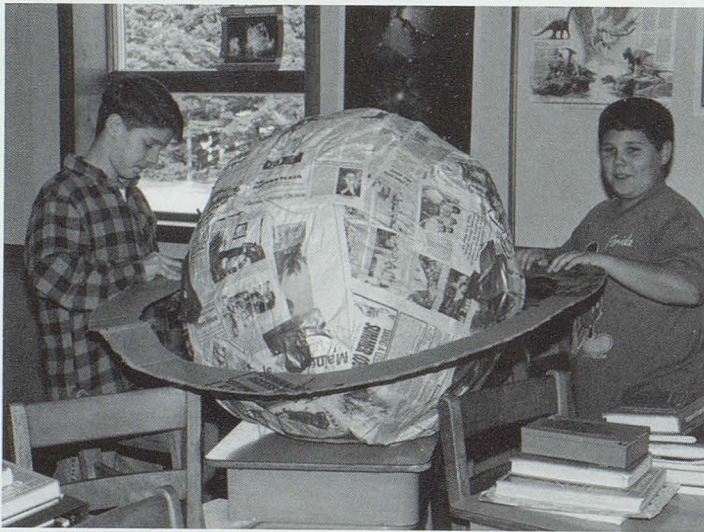

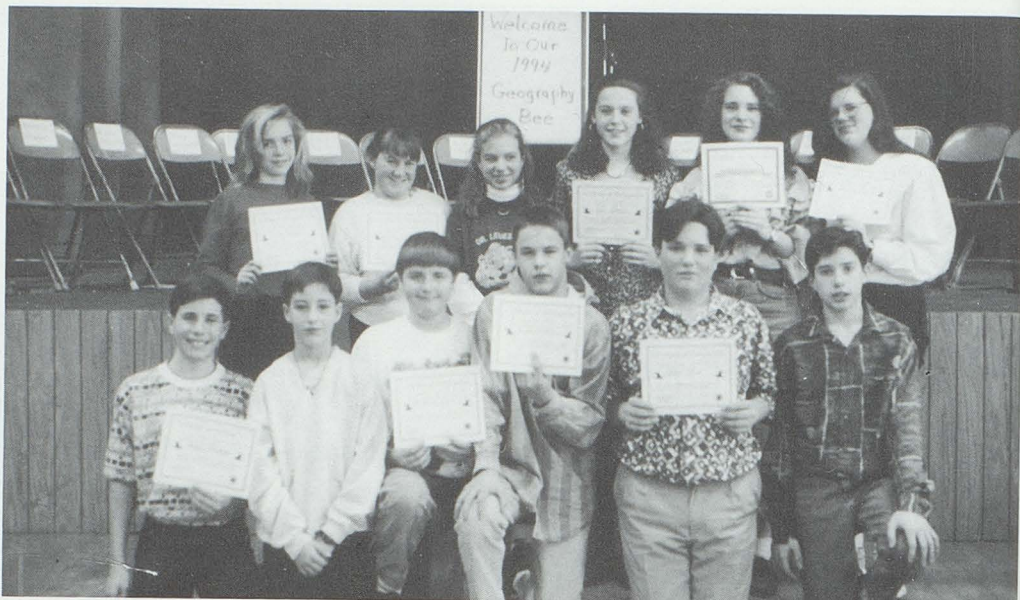
## SAD 33 BEE

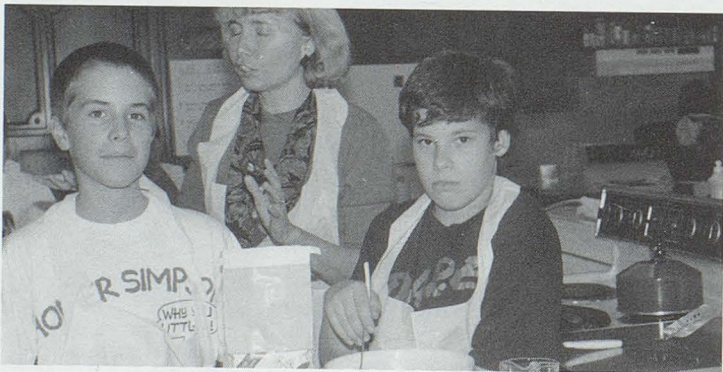
## PLOYES

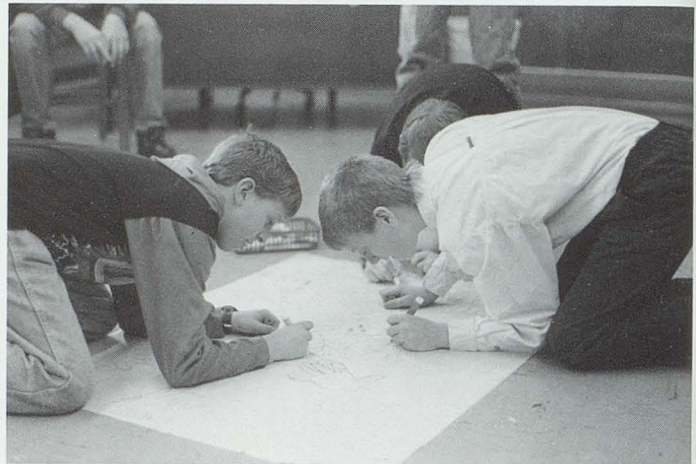
On January 18, parents were invited to a pot-luck

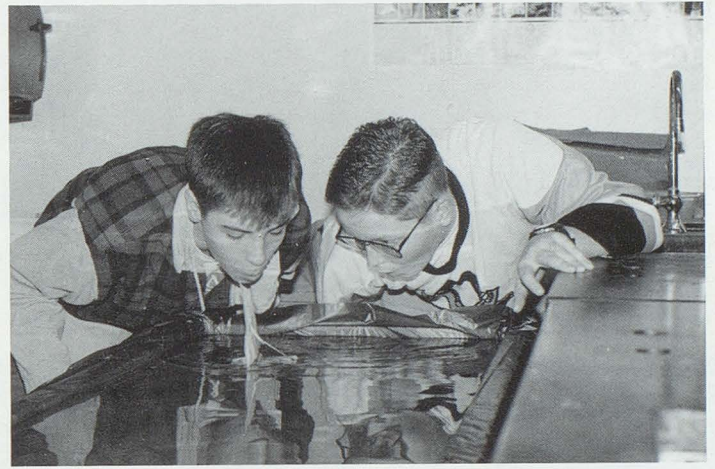
# Whatever Makes Your Boat Float ~ and Go...

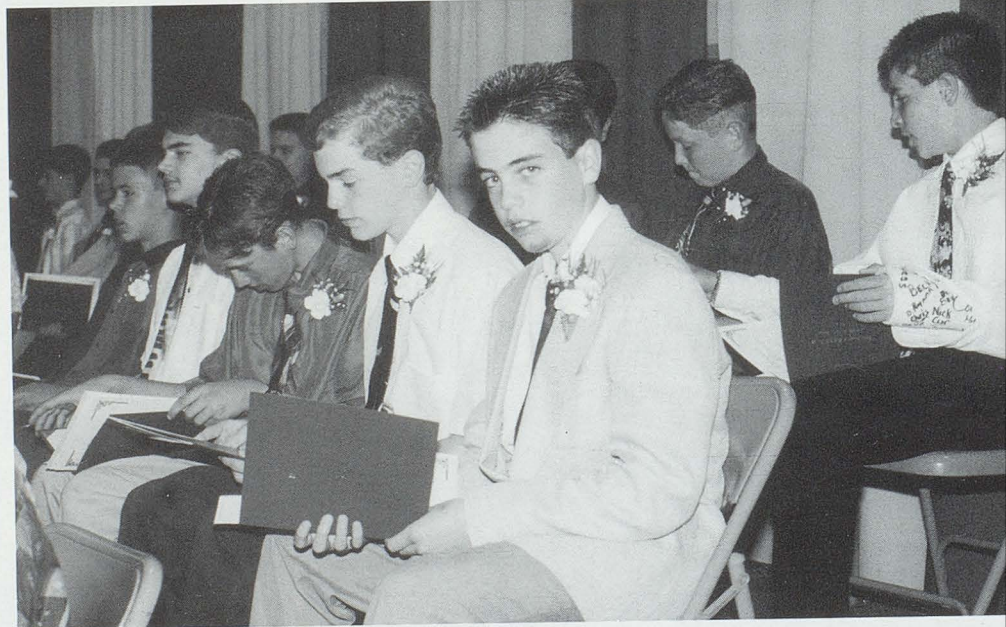

There are some very interesting things that happen at Wisdom almost all the time.

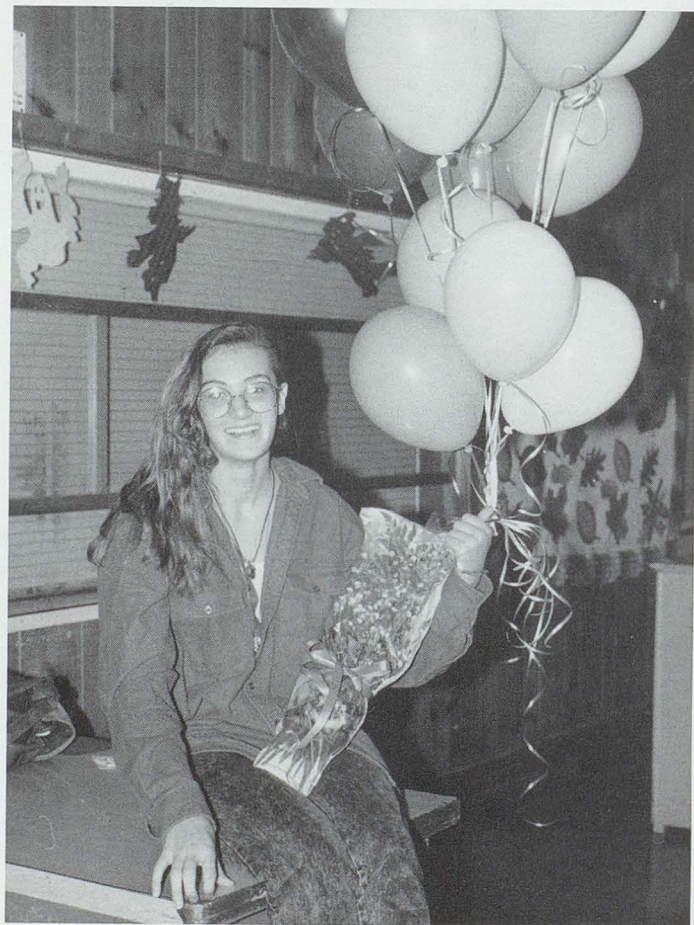
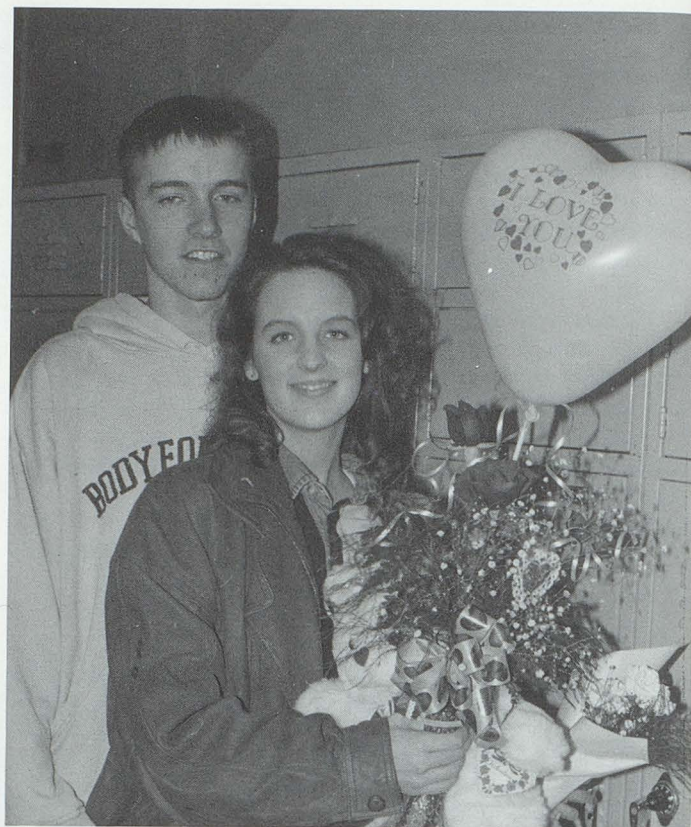
Lately, the giving of roses has caught on real well. The question is, What for?.

Why give roses? Because we're proud, happy and in love. There are no better reasons.





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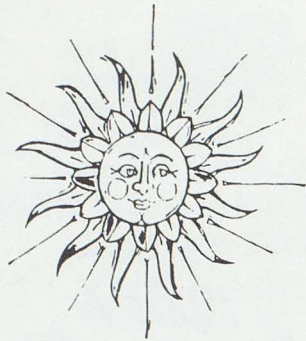
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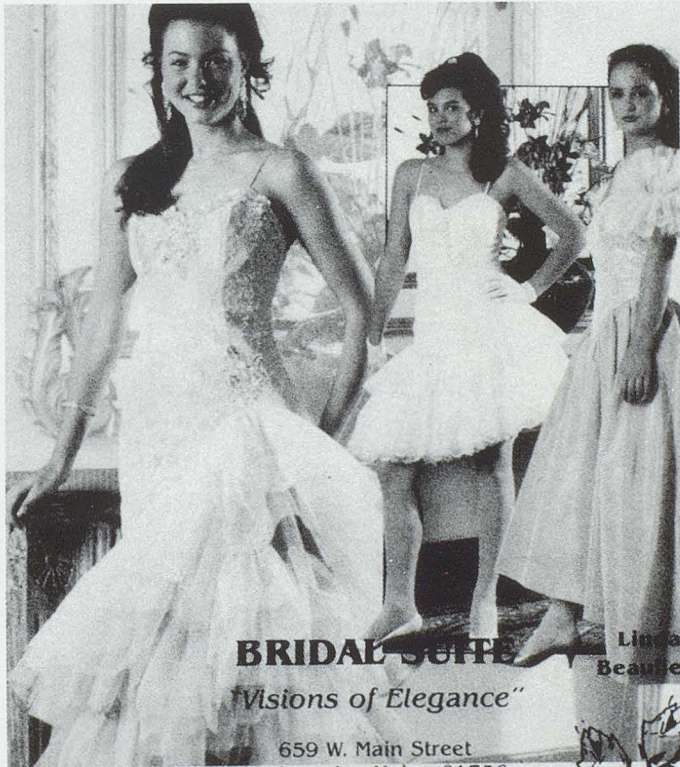
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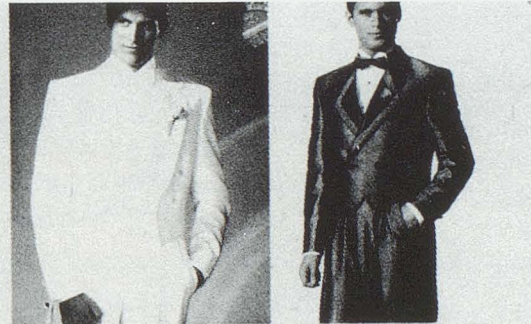


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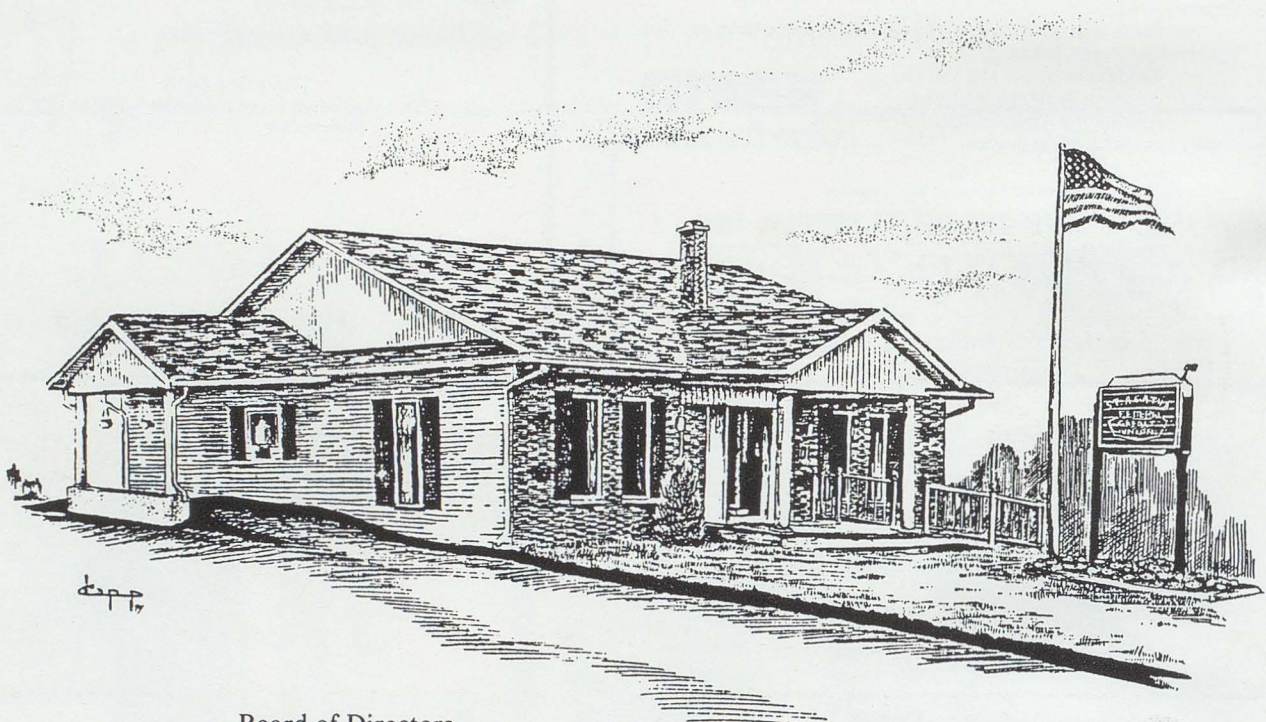
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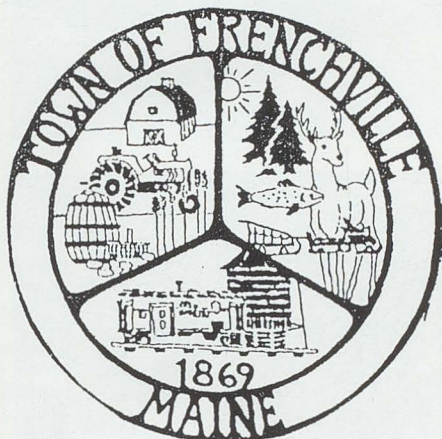
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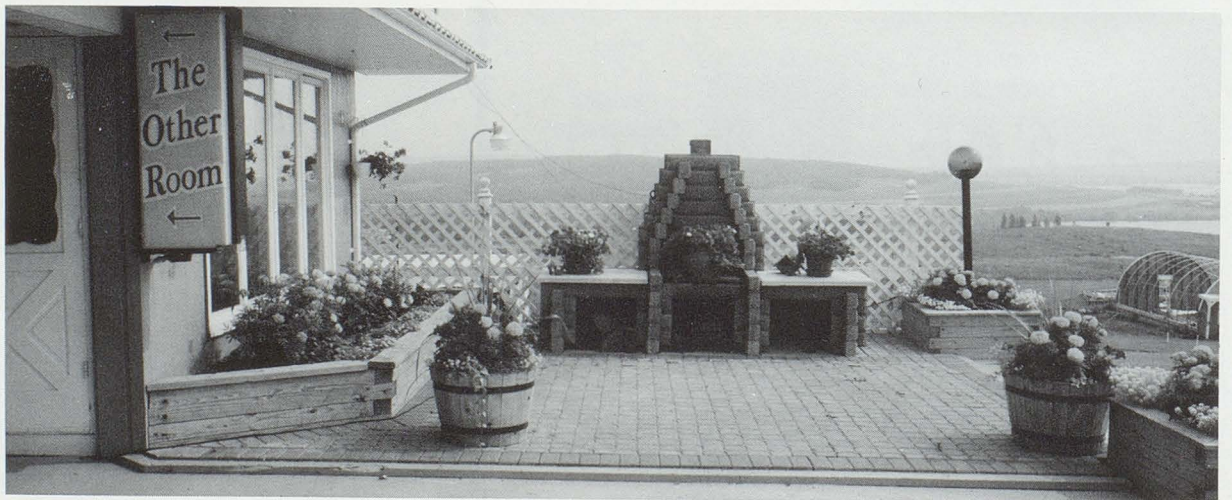
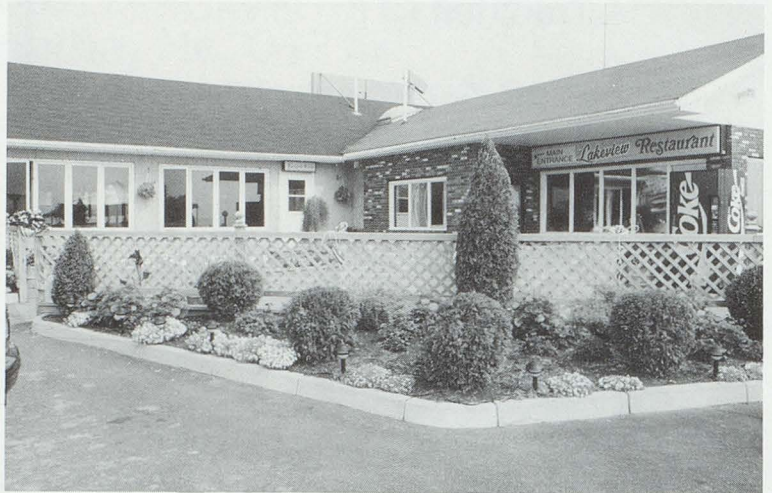
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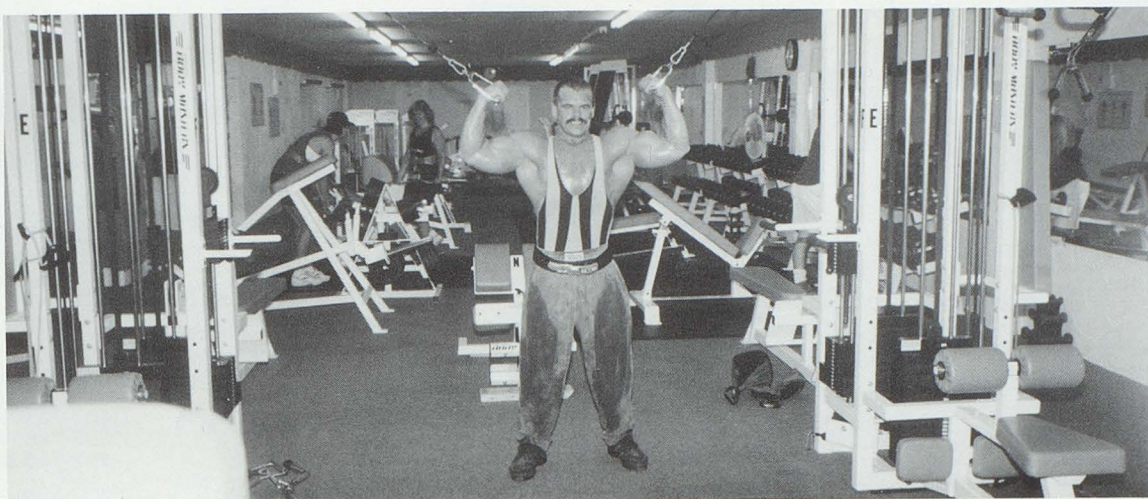
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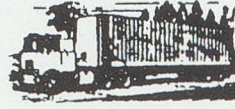
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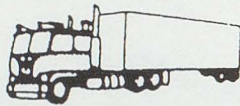


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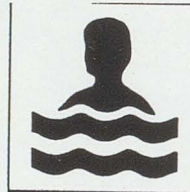
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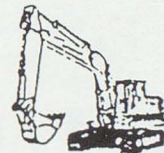
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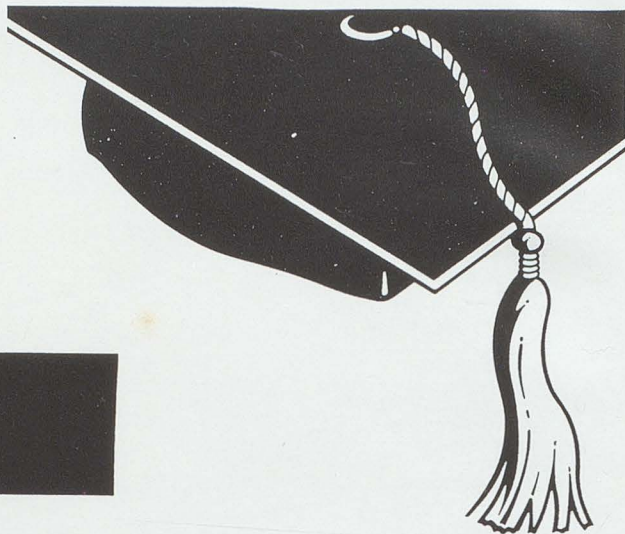


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
