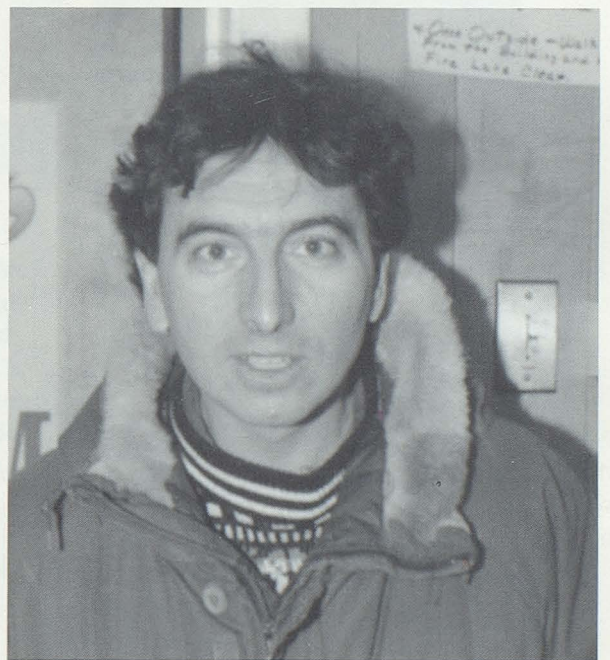
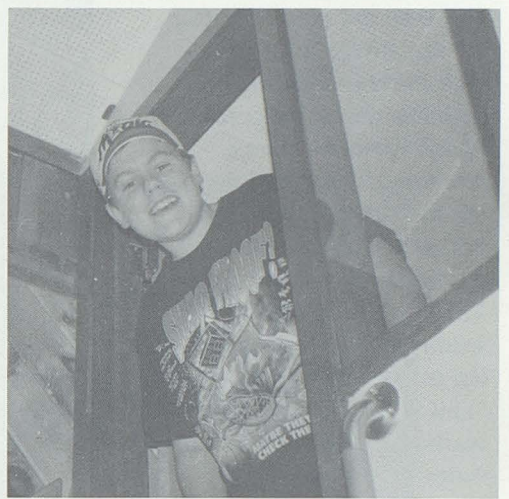
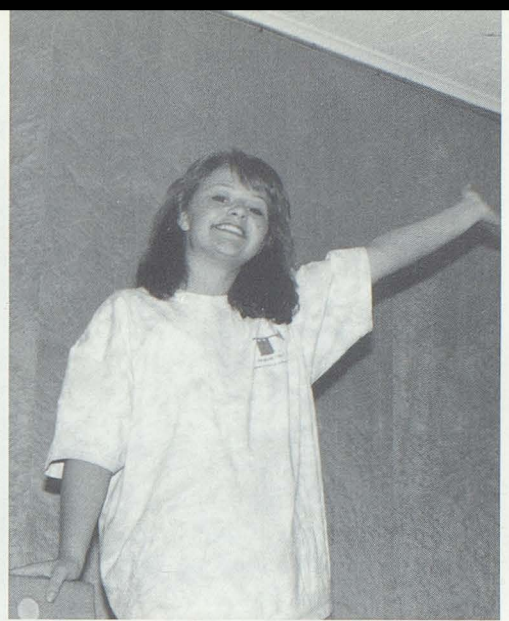
WISDOM DRAMA CLUB

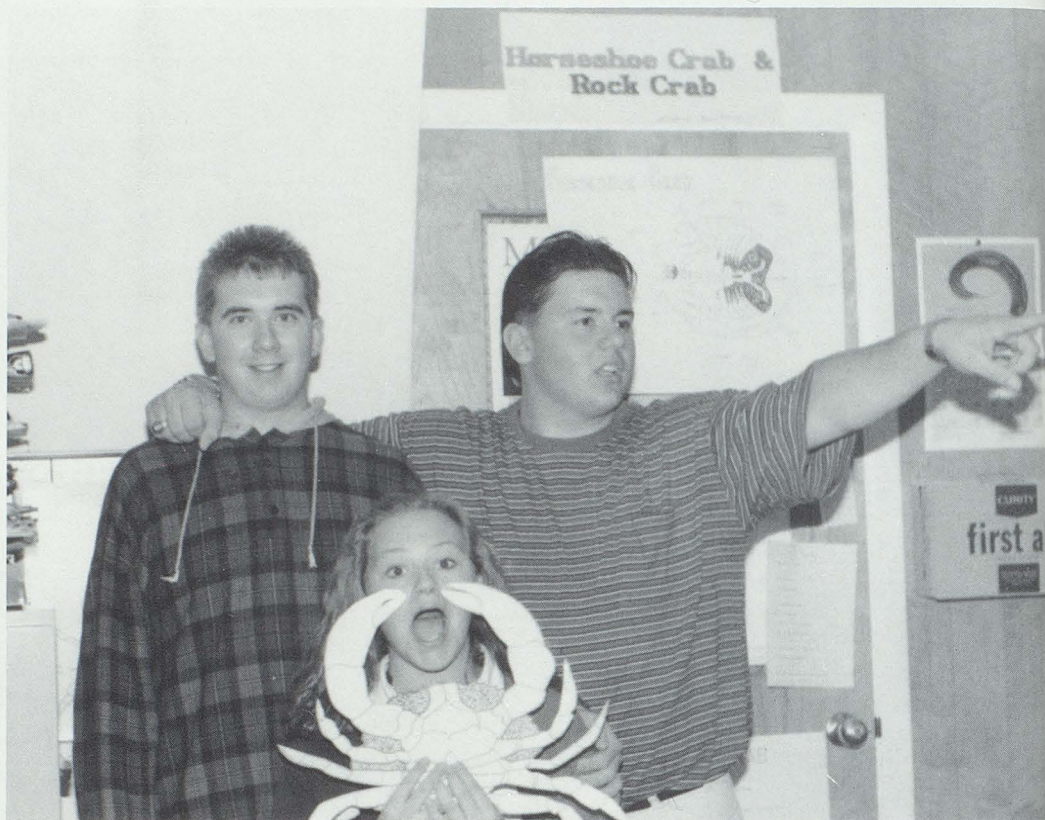

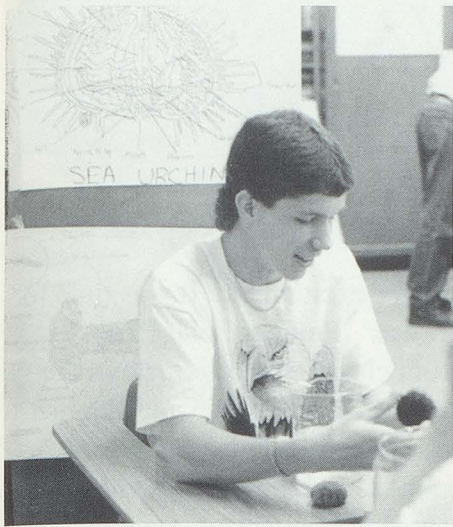




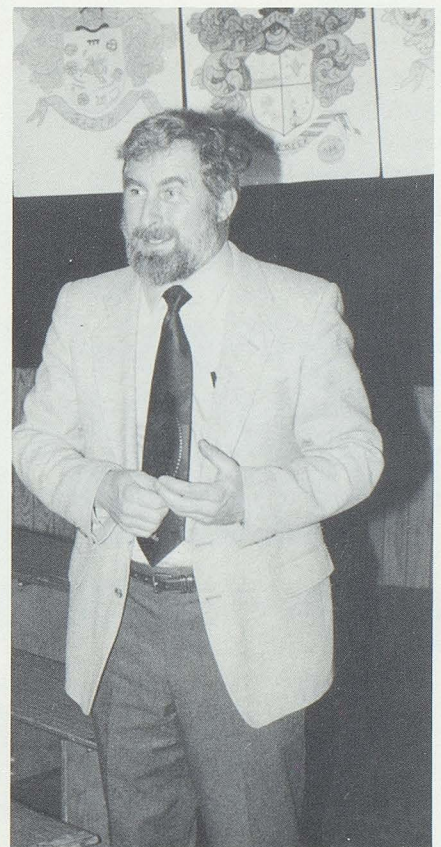
"The Sea Comes to the Classroom"

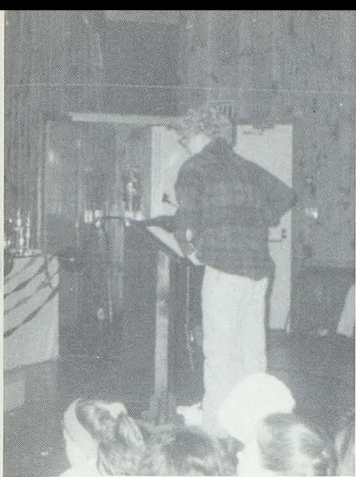

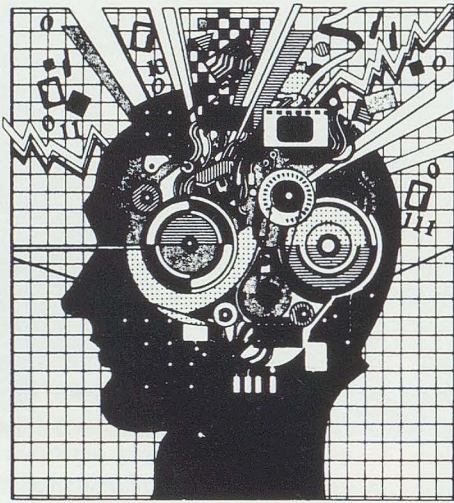

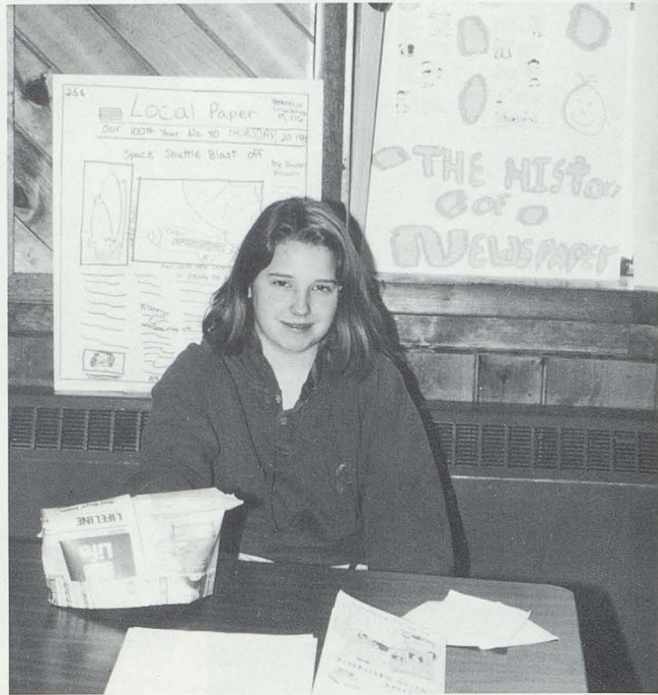


Geography Bee
