PIONEER BOYS' CHAMPIONSHIP SEASON

"In all the year's I've seen the Pioneer boys play, this has been the best team at Wisdom High School," said one fan as he watched the guys play Madawaska and beat them 2-0. The "boys" pretty much proved to be the best team. With dedication, hard work, and lots of skill, this team earned their way to the Eastern Maine Championship game with a 12-2-2 record. Although the "boys" felt the Eastern Maine game against the Greenville Lakers should have been theirs, they fell just short with a disappointing 1-0 overtime loss.

"A key moment in the season," says Coach Michaud, "was our ability to

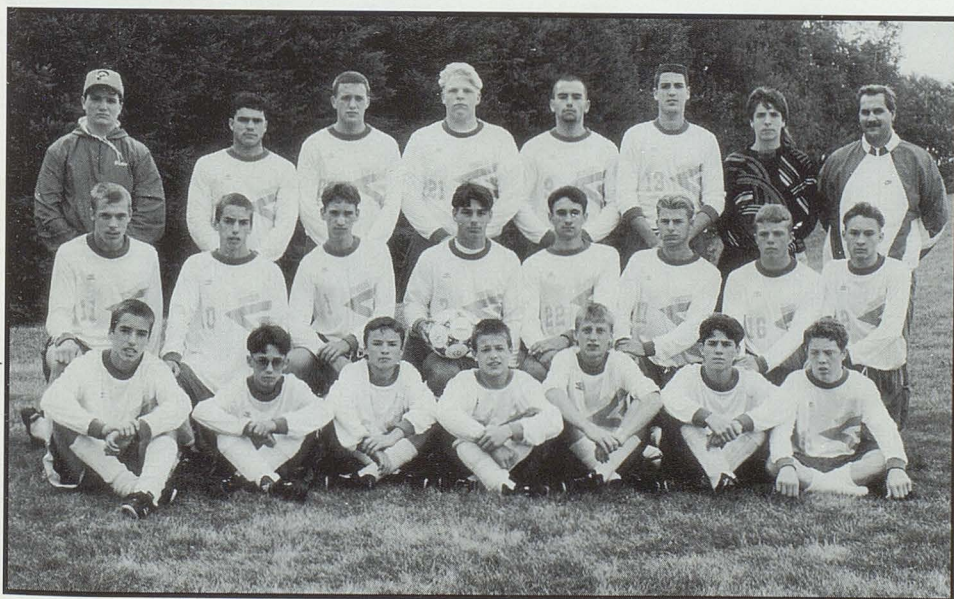
bounce back from a devastating overtime loss to Madawaska after winning our first 3 games of the season."

This year's team was led by seniors who had a great deal of athletic skills. Keith Michaud, who played like the ball was connected to his foot, ended the season with 19 goals, 13 assists, with a total of 32 points, while Craig Thibeault, who runs on pure oxygen, contributed 23 goals and a total of 27 points. "Although we had two individuals who led the Valley in scoring, all 21 individuals played key roles in the success of our season," expressed Coach Michaud about the team.

In Paul Michaud's second year as coach, he has done an excellent job coaching the "boys" to a second place spot finishing the season with the rewarding Eastern Maine Runner's-up plaque. That was a big jump for the Pioneers, who had ended last year in seventh place losing to Greenville in the Quarter Finals.

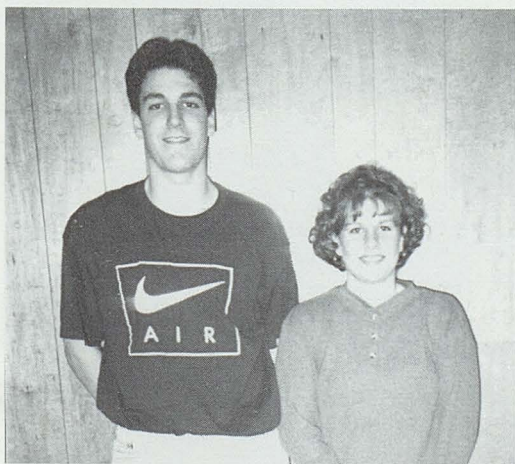
NHS

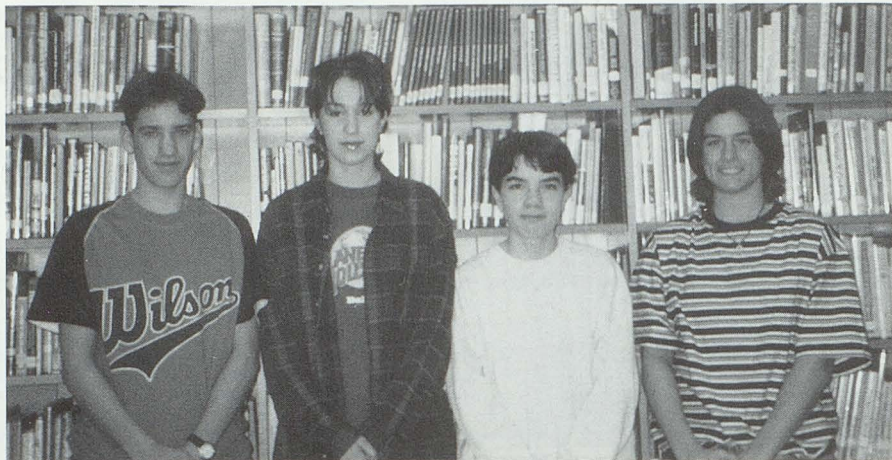

All-State Auditioners

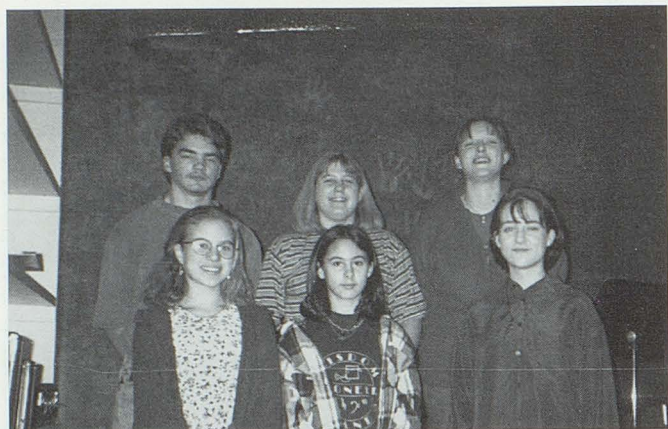
