All American Lives Matter

I want to let you know that regardless of what is going on in the rest of the country the American Legion and Post 803 is still committed to the Four Pillars of the American Legion. The pillar that is under the most severe attack is Americanism. There are some in the United States that believe that our Nation is evil and our history is evil and it should be destroyed. I have to argue that this is an absurd point of view and the fact that this view has gained such large support is dangerous for our Nation.

If we choose to view The United States as founded upon evil principles and infused with systemic racism then we must choose to disregard all historical facts. The Unites States is comprised of imperfect creatures from our Founding Fathers to our current leaders holding political office both left and right. Our Nation's history is filled with imperfect acts but the most amazing aspect of our Nation is its ability to evolve and progress. Have we lost sight of the fact that we suffered a Civil War? Have we forgotten that white abolitionists fought against the evils of slavery and they won? Have we lost sight of the amazing progress that has been made in civil rights just in the past 60 years? Has the youth of today become drunk on a baseless narrative that blacks in America are under assault by the police? What statistical data is supporting this view? Just because a narrative is repeated over and over again does not make it right. Just because our eyes are constantly bombarded by select videos of horrific acts conducted by police officers while good acts get no coverage does not mean the horrific ones are most prevalent. 
