
#### **MWR RENTALS / CENTERS**

## **Radical Revolution**

I recently finished reading an amazing book about the American Revolution called *The Radicalism of the American Revolution* by Pulitzer Prize winner Gordon S. Wood. The basic premise of the book is to highlight the fact that the American Revolution was one of the most radical events in world history and the consequences of the Revolution were more positive than they were negative for humanity. The author makes a great point when he states the following:



To focus, as we are today apt to do, on what the Revolution did not accomplish- highlighting and lamenting its failure to abolish slavery and change fundamentally the lot of women-is to miss the great significance of what it did accomplish; indeed, the Revolution made possible the anti-slavery and women's rights movements of the nineteenth century and in fact all our current egalitarian thinking. The Revolution not only radically changed the personal and social relationships of people, including the position of women, but also destroyed aristocracy as it had been understood in the Western world for at least two millennia. I think those Americans that hate and desire to constantly criticize America should ask the question, "What if the Revolution never happened?" Would such a person have the freedom to hate the State that would have existed had America never been?


