Retirees and military family members who have identification cards with no expiration date can choose to upgrade to the new **Next Generation Uniform Services Identification, or USID,** cards whenever it's convenient -- as long as it's done within the next four years, according to the Defense Department. There is no looming deadline for use of those old non-active duty cards without expiration dates, but the department expects to completely phase out and replace them with the next-generation IDs, which are more durable and have enhanced security features, by 2026. DoD plans to phase out and cancel the existing card forms in 2026, after then, only the USID card will be accepted for installation and benefits access. The USID format for military retirees and dependents represents a new design closely resembling the Common Access Card, or CAC, format issued to active-duty troops and department civilians. Those with cards with no expiration dates "may have the card replaced at their convenience," it is recommended to go to the **ID Card Office Online (https://idco.dmdc.osd.mil/idco/)** and use the office locator to find a site that issues the new cards and book an appointment. Retirees and their dependents, dependents of active-duty troops, reserve members and Medal of Honor recipients are among those who will receive the USID cards. ### War is Over. Now What?

Some of the most impactful moments in a Veteran's life are those experienced while on a deployment. These moments are shared with those one deploys with but often these fellow Veterans are never seen again after returning home. For some the moments shared are horrific moments scorched into memories or tattooed upon the flesh. We are all very familiar with the acronym PTSD (Post Traumatic Stress Disorder). Many Veterans suffer from PTSD and it is very difficult for them to find meaningful ways to address it in their personal lives. Sometimes simply talking to fellow Veterans is a healthy way to process the effects of PTSD. Recently the Legion supported my Afghanistan reunion through the Warrior Reunion Foundation. I did not really understand just how impactful the reunion would be until it was complete. The reunion granted a group of Veterans the opportunity to sit around a fire and joke about the good times and the bad times during the deployment. It granted the guys and opportunity to connect with family members of Soldier's lost and our local community members that were impacted by 9/11. Our Sons of the Legion commander Gary Iorio and SAL member Brian Hughes immediately connected with Soldiers that were inspired to join the military because of what the NYPD and NYC Fire Fighters sacrificed on that horrible day. Other Veterans like Bob Scott shared his experiences in Vietnam creating an immediate connection with today's current warriors. We held a memorial service for those lost in combat and those lost after combat to ensure we honored their duty. This ceremony was made more meaningful by the participation of volunteers helping with the reunion and the presence of Auxiliary members that work so hard to help our local Veterans. This reunion would not have been successful if not for so many that volunteered their time and resources. Dean and Jamie Eichorn cooked up their "Nice Bun" sliders for all to enjoy as attendees arrived on their first day at Cliff Cornell's farm. He provided a safe place for the guys to bunk and relax as well as coordinating a fishing trip and dinner at the Wayside restaurant. Daryl Ketchum the president of the Mattituck Gun club hosted the guys and provided ammo for them to shoot. Tina Ginas cooked amazing cookies the guys devoured while simultaneously consuming tasty beer provided by the Greenport Harbor Brewing Company. Jamie Ginas provided cigars the guys smoked while sitting around the firepit reminiscing. The Auxiliary and the Legionnaires provided funds to help support needed supplies to include water, Gatorade, BBQ food and supplies and North Fork Sanitation provided a dumpster for the reunion's aftermath. All of this would never have occurred if it were not for the Warrior Reunion Team. I cannot say enough about this organization. The reunion's they sponsor have a DIRECT POSITIVE impact on the lives of those that risked it all so that we may have the freedoms we enjoy.
