Post Status: We currently have 190/207 (91.8%) paid up members for 2023. You can still send in your dues , for 2023, please state your check is for 2023. Starting 1 July we have 87/181 (48.1%) paid up members for 2024. It is easier to process your renewals now instead of waiting for 1 January 2024. Once a month I check to see who has paid their dues on-line, then mail out their Membership Cards. We have 6 on-line renewals so far. The paid up for life members (PUFL) have their membership cards mailed to them from the National American Legion at the beginning of the membership year on 1 July. The transition to the automated system to manage membership is still changing and we are keeping up. PACT ACT - WHAT VETERANS' CAREGIVERS SHOULD KNOW

The PACT Act expands VA health care and benefits to Veterans exposed to burn pits, Agent Orange, and other toxic substances. This law helps VA provide generations of Veterans—and their survivors—with the care and benefits they've earned and deserve. In addition, Veterans enrolled in PACT Act can help advance research, education, and treatment related to toxic exposures. The Caregiver Support Program (CSP) encourages caregivers of Veterans to learn more about PACT Act, including benefits, eligibility, and how to file a claim.

CSP provides comprehensive support for all caregivers of Veterans.
