



Historian

I have one more paper to write in order to officially receive my Master of Arts in History from Norwich University. I chose to cover the very early stages of the Cold War and a pivotal choice that President Harry S. Truman had to make. Over the next few months I will share with you what I'm writing and learning. Here is an introduction to start our historical journey together:

Helmstedt-Marienborn border crossing was a demarcation line between the British and Soviet occupation zones in Germany. This border crossing was established in 1945 but in less than three years it became the backdrop of the Cold War. On June 24, 1948 the Soviet Military Administration (SMA) stopped all rail traffic at Marienborn. This action was one of many that the Soviets executed in order to block Western access to Berlin. These blocking actions presented President Harry S. Truman with a dilemma unlike any he had previously faced as President. He could use Allied combat forces to break the blockade and risk war, he could choose some form of diplomatic means to re-establish freedom of maneuver or he could capitulate and allow the Soviets full control of Berlin.

What do you think you would do in this situation? What factors would you need to consider before responding to the Soviets? Did you know that Germany was divided into zones after the WWII and Berlin the capital was divided into sections too? Did you know that Berlin was entirely surrounded by the Soviet zone and the British, U.S. and French sections in Berlin were accessed by rail, road, and air but only by going through the Soviet zone? Why was this?
