Arlington National Cemetery Service for 1LT George R. Sullivan

George will be buried at Arlington National Cemetery at 9AM on Monday, March 30th. For those of you that wish to attend his service we are meeting at the American Legion on Sunday the 29th at 10AM to carpool to hotels in DC and then to the service in the morning. After the service we are going to visit the American Veterans Disabled for Life Memorial in Washington, D.C. which features a quote from George on one of the glass panels engraved with "Voices of the Veterans" — quotes from disabled veterans detailing their experiences as stated by Megan Collins George's daughter.

His quote reads:

"Yes, I wished things would have worked out a little better for me, but I did come home alive and had a fairly successful life."

After this we will visit the USMC museum in his honor. Some of those attending are booking their hotels at Hilton Garden Inn Arlington/Courthouse Plaza located 1333 North Courthouse Road Arlington, VA 22201 Phone 703-528-4444.

You may also try the Le Meridien Arlington Marriot located 1121 19th St N. Arlington VA 22209 Phone 703-351-9170.

Note the following information:

- Arlington National Cemetery has increased its security posture and is implementing 100% ID checks at all entrances.
- Visitors 18 years of age and older must present a valid U.S. state or federal government-issued photo identification for entry.
- Visitors 16 and 17 years old who do not have a U.S.

state or federal government-issued photo identification may present an official school-issued photo identification for entry.

- Persons who are not U.S. citizens must present a valid passport or U.S. State Department-issued photo identification for entry.
- The service starting location is at the Administration Building.
- Please arrive 45 minutes ahead of time with your vehicles. Proceed to the security guards and notify them you are here for a service. You will need vehicle transportation throughout the service.





HISTORIAN

Last month was Black History Month and I did not write an article pertaining to this because we lost 1LT George Sullivan and we needed to honor him. I'm writing an article now because I think it is imperative that we communicate the great strides that have occurred in America regarding race. In my opinion there is too much extreme rhetoric occurring regarding race because sadly this topic can be an excellent way for some individuals to benefit politically from the division race topics can elicit.

I read an article in the February 13th issue of the Suffolk Times titled, "A month of learning is great, but we need to do more" This article compelled me to respond because I was particularly struck by the following statement, "Their histories as told are incomplete if we don't also note that many of those families were slave owners-not to judge them through a 21st-century lens, but just to round out the story." I found this particular portion of the article so important because we need to be very careful before we pick up a judgment stone to dash upon those of the past or present. We need to understand the historical context surrounding the lives of those that lived in the past. It is so easy for us today to say, "I wouldn't treat black people like that if I lived then!" Yea...so why is that? It is probably because you were born in a time or in a family that encouraged equality. What if you were a kid born in a family of KKK members? How much intestinal fortitude would you have to resist your father or mother if they were KKK members? Imagine being a child that endures day in and day out a gong of condemnation for anyone of a different color from his or her parents? I have to argue that systemic racism **does not exist** in the United States. Racism does indeed exist in the United States but we have made such amazing progress to foster equality and to suppress and destroy the freedom racists possessed in the past. My response to this article speaks of that progress we have made and I repeat it here:

I always say that America is the, "Perfect imperfection!" What I mean by this is America is not perfect and it can never be perfect given the imperfections of its citizens. The beauty of our system of government is the design of checks and balances.

Our Founding Fathers understood the failings of their fellow humans and how horrible we can be toward each other and many of them understood the evil of slavery too. They understood that it would not just go away simply.

The choice was to form a union with its imperfect aspects or just give up. Anyone that has ever run a non-for-profit or any type of volunteer organization knows that it is difficult to get the team to agree on what color to paint the walls. Now imagine how difficult it was to form a Union

comprised of some people that wanted slavery abolished and others that relied on it for their economy. Yea...they had more heated discussions than we do on the color of the walls.

The bottom line is they did not give up. They built a system that would allow growth, change, and eventually the ending of the evil system of slavery through blood and conflict but it ended.

It ended because there were a lot of white men willing to die for the Union and to die for the principles to end slavery. Did we finally have an African American President? Yes! He too was elected President because there were a lot of white people willing to vote for him.

When I joined the Marines in 1991 one of the first things out of my drill instructor's mouths after they said, "Drop and give me 50!" was, "The only color in the Marines is GREEN!" That was the color of our uniforms in 1991 and that is the moto that honestly many Americans of all colors believe and exhibit in their behavior.

Is America still struggling with race issues? Absolutely, but we all must realize the distance we have covered while never forgetting the starting point. Slavery was evil! Racism is evil! Don't forget the past but also don't condemn the living for the sins of the dead.

I'm just a GREEN Colored Marine!
