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

ACCESS TO HOME PROGRAM



Home Accessibility Options for Veterans

CDCLI is pleased to make the Access to Home Program available.

Veterans with a service-related disability may qualify for accessibility modifications in their homes or apartments through the Access to Home Program.

The Access to Home Program provides financial assistance for the cost of adapting homes to meet the needs of those with disabilities. These home improvements are designed to sustain one's independence, and will enable veterans to safely and comfortably continue to live in their home.

Grants are offered up to \$20,000 for homeowners who agree to continue to own their home for five years following services. If this is adhered to, the grant is forgiven after 5 years. If the five-year period is not met, the grant must be repaid on a prorated basis.


Home modifications may include:

- ·Ramps and lifts, handrails, expanded doorways, stair glides
- •Kitchen and bathroom modifications
- •Roll-in showers, grab bars and seat
- · Special thermostatic and environmental controls

QUALIFICATIONS:

Total household income does not exceed income limits; the occupant is physically disabled or has substantial difficulty with an activity of daily living because of aging; a veteran who has a service-related disability certified by the VA or DOD.

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HISTORIAN

I think it is fitting to dedicate this article to the founding of the American Legion. The Legion's first caucus occurred during the month of March in 1919. Here is an article from the American Legion detailing the Legions first year:

The American Legion was chartered by Congress in 1919 as a patriotic veterans organization. Focusing on service to veterans, servicemembers and communities, the Legion evolved from a group of war-weary veterans of World War I into one of the most influential nonprofit groups in the United States. Membership swiftly grew to over 1 million, and local posts sprang up across the country. Today, membership stands at over 2 million in more than 13,000 posts worldwide. The posts are organized into 55 departments: one each for the 50 states, along with the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico, France, Mexico and the Philippines.

Over the years, the Legion has influenced considerable social change in America, won hundreds of benefits for veterans and produced many important programs for children and youth. Here are some key dates for the Legions first year:

March 15-17

Members of the American Expeditionary Force convene in Paris for the first American Legion caucus.

May 8-10

St. Louis Caucus. "The American Legion" is adopted as the organization's official name. The Legion's draft preamble and constitution are approved.

June 9

The National Executive Committee adopts the Legion emblem.

Sept. 16

Congress charters The American Legion.

Nov. 10-12

First Legion convention convenes in Minneapolis. The Constitution and preamble are adopted. Delegates vote 361-323 to locate the Legion's national headquarters in Indianapolis, instead of Washington. A resolution is passed in support of Boy Scouts of America. Today, the Legion is the chartering agency for more than 1,700 Scouting units made up of approximately 64,000 youths.
