#### **EXTRA PLANTS?**

Somebody will use them.



#### **VEGGIE WEIGH-IN**

Paperwork ... a necessary evil. And we dislike it as much as you do. But, in order to keep getting the grants that make it possible to enlarge and improve the garden, we have to provide evidence that the Garden is actually producing food. Last year we did a lot of guessing on the quantity that was produced. This year, we'd like to have a wee bit more accuracy! We have purchased a Digital Scale with a hanging web basket, for you to weigh your "stuff"! It's hanging between the water tanks! Please keep a record of your produce and weight (example: 20 lbs carrots) and at the end of the harvest we'll send you a form to complete with your info.

And to make it a little fun, we're going to have a contest to see who grows the largest quantity (in Lbs) and who grows the biggest single Zuchinni, Carrot, Parsnip, Broccoli head, Cauliflower Head, Corn Cob, or whatever you grow that can be measured by weight. Take a photo of it and send it to us as an email attachment. The picture should include the scale, showing the weight, and the vegetable. You can enter more than once but only the biggest one will be counted. THERE WILL BE PRIZES! We-uns will have ourselves a Lemp Garden Fair!

### Taking Care of your Garden A gentle reminder

Garden Maintenance can become a problem if you do not water and weed, and control insect infestations, such as Aphids (we sent you a recipe in the May Newsletter). We will contact you if we see a problem. That is why your application form has the name and contact info for someone to call if we cannot reach you. The following rules are from the Gardeners Welcome Packet, Gardener Guidelines.

# 6. <u>Gardeners should have their beds fully planted by the third week of June</u> and remove all vegetation and debris by September 30<sup>th</sup>.

Today, June 6, we performed a "walk-through" of the garden. As of this afternoon there appear to be 8 beds that have not been planted. June 15 is coming fast and we will be contacting the gardeners to find out what their plans are. We have a waiting list so if you have changed your mind about planting, please contact us and save us the time of contacting you.

10. Please keep the garden area free of litter and weeds. Place all trash in the provided trash container that is near the water tanks and place plant debris in the provided composting area outside the fence. Gardeners must maintain their beds, keeping them weed- free and cared for. If a bed appears abandoned, it may be reassigned to someone else.

At this time we are still working on the trash and plant debris problem. Please place all of it in the Garbage Bin that is located by the water tanks.
