The New Hampshire Department of Environmental Services, Waste Management Division (NHDES) is hosting an online public input session on proposed changes to the New Hampshire Code of Administrative Rules for Solid Waste Management, namely, Env-Sw 800, Landfill Requirements, and Env-Sw 1400, Financial Assurance. This public input session is being held in advance of the formal rulemaking process and will include a brief discussion of the existing rules, proposed changes under consideration, and opportunity for public input.
