Dear Messiah,

We have just crossed over into a new year. Well, as Christians we're nearly a month into our new year, but the world has finally caught up. For Messiah, it's been a year of firsts, and it's good to remember such things when turning "the page." Especially for you, Messiah, this has been a year to remember.

I've shared a lot of thoughts about this history making year for us. But at this point in a fresh new year, I want to look forward.

From the book Keep Going: The Art of Perseverance by Joseph M. Marshall III,

Grandfather says this: "Being strong means taking one more step toward the top of the hill, no matter how weary you may be. It means letting the tears flow through the grief. It means to keep looking for the answer, though the darkness of despair is all around you. Being strong means to cling to hope for one more heartbeat, one more sunrise. Each step, no matter how difficult, is one more step closer to the top of the hill. To keep hope alive for one more heartbeat at a time leads to the light of the next sunrise, and the promise of a new day."

It was a hard way to close 2023 - for me personally but for all of us as well. Lenny Erickson's death was the end of a period of learning for me. As I said at his funeral, he taught me a great number of things. I take those lessons with me into this new year but it's a lesson itself, walking into this new year with his absence.

And Andrea. I was reminded at Andrea's funeral that such celebrations mark the start of grief, not its end. It has been some days since her funeral – simply the biggest funeral in Messiah's history – but I am only coming to terms with her absence now, today.

"Be strong" is not what I'm trying to say here. Rather, keep going, Messiah. We have come a long way in a year, but in the words of another writer, "The woods are lovely, dark and deep / but I have promises to keep / And miles to go before I sleep / And miles to go before I sleep."

It was an historic year for you, Messiah. And here is another – one that promises more celebration, more loss, and more hills that need climbing. So we keep going, one step at a time, knowing that Christ goes with us, even as he goes on ahead us, leading the way.

Each month Messiah Lutheran supports a designated charity. If you would like to contribute to this cause, please designate "special offering" on your check or with your online gift. This month our special offering is for Baretooth Cupboards, our local food bank.

Items Food Banks Need the Most

<u>Taste of Home</u> recommends these items as those most needed at Food Banks based on their shelf life, nutritional value and flexibility, and taste. Lower sodium products and easy open containers (pop tops) are recommended.

Baretooth Cupboards is our local food pantry and Messiah's special offering focus in January. We are hoping to collect thirty boxes containing \$25 in grocery items plus a <u>\$10 donation</u> for a voucher to be used by clients for laundry detergent and coordinated with **Beartooth Market**. You may make up your box with any combination of these products. As an example, those items highlighted in <u>yellow</u> would collectively cost about \$25 for one each.

We will use a Thrivent grant to purchase one each applesauce, pasta, chili, and stew for each box.

1. Applesauce

Plastic jars or cups of unsweetened applesauce **2. Canned Beans** High in protein and complements several other choices.

3. Canned Chicken

Its versatility and high protein content make it a popular item at food banks.

4. Canned Fish (Tuna and Salmon)

Food banks are most in need of canned tuna and salmon.

5. Canned Meat (SPAM and Ham)

It's shelf-stable, doesn't require much prep or equipment to eat, and delivers a quick hit of protein.

6. Canned Vegetables (3 cans)

Colorful, nutrient-dense, and fiber-rich – vegetables are always in high demand, and canned varieties last the longest on a food bank's shelves.

7. Cooking Oils (Olive or Canola)

Food banks rely heavily on these essential and pricier items being donated.

8. Crackers

Perfect as a snack or as a base for canned meats. Whole grain crackers are the best bet.

9. Dried Herbs and Spices (2)

It's hard to cook a tasty meal without herbs and spices like oregano, basil, cumin, pepper, rosemary, thyme, garlic powder, and cinnamon.

10. Fruit (Canned or Dried)

Fruit, whether dried, canned or in plastic cups, makes excellent snacks for kids and adults and provide some nutrition and fiber.

11. Granola Bars

Food banks are always in need of quick and easy items that families can toss into lunches.

12. Instant Mashed Potatoes

Instant potatoes last longer and require minimal tools and ingredients to whip up. 13. Nuts

A handful of nuts provides protein and nutrients in a hurry

and is perfect for snacks and lunches.

14. Pasta

This is a food bank staple since it's easy to turn into a meal. 15. Peanut Butter

Kids and adults like it, and it's

high in protein, making peanut butter one of the most popular items at food banks.

16. Rice

Brown rice is filling, versatile and easy to prepare and store.

Quinoa is also a great item to donate.

17. Shelf-stable and Powdered Milk

Because no fridge is required to keep this milk fresh, it's accessible for everyone.

18. Evaporated Milk

Versatile with a long shelf life. 19. Soup, Stew and Chili

These canned or packaged items acts as a warm and filling lunch or dinner and often come complete with protein (meat) and veggies.

20. Whole Grain Cereal

Here's another popular item with all ages, since whole grain cereal makes a healthy breakfast or snack.
