The point is this: whoever sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and whoever sows bountifully will also reap bountifully. Each one must give as he has decided in his heart, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver.

Dear Messiah,

In my former life as a Youth and Family Minister, I worked with kids in 5th grade to 12th grade, as well as some college aged young adults and parents. My mentor in this work began every gathering of whatever age group it was with a time of sharing. We called it Highs and Lows. Each person would share what was going well in life that day or a welcome experience they were having (Highs), and they would share what was weighing them down that day, whatever was "in the way" of life (Lows).

I've found that this practice of sharing is both simple and powerful. It's an uncomplicated way for people to share the substance of their lives - the things they're dealing with, whether hard or gladening. In this way it's incarnational, taking into account the "here and now" of people's lives. Hearing from those who wanted to share changed the purpose for the gatherings, changing its focus from the work that needed doing to the people who gathered to do it. Whether the substance of our lives is shared or not in such gatherings - committee work, bible study, council meetings, or worship - it is all present with us. Sharing it though, opens our eyes to the social and spiritual landscape that might otherwise be overlooked.

And in fact, this practice of sharing highs and lows is old. It has roots deep in the spiritual practice of St. Ignatius of Loyola (1491-1556 CE) who, after a decorated military career, turned to religious life. His is a full story of conversion, but his contribution to Christian religious practice is the development of his Spiritual Exercises - a set of meditations, contemplations, and prayers that include a method of reading scripture. And one of the exercises he introduced was this practice of contemplating one's highs and lows - or, in his words, consolations and desolations. (This is all simplified but you get the point).

I have had a number of conversations recently that have pointed to the way we sometimes communicate here at Messiah, where the substance of people's lives are subservient to the work that needs doing. I see this practice of sharing as one way to live out our call of loving God and neighbor. By beginning gatherings this way, we might better "keep our eye on the ball," so-tospeak, recentering our lives on Christ, present in the lived experience of the people with whom we gather and share life in community. Our most basic Christian call, and a simple practice indeed.



What are Highs and Lows (Consolations and Desolations)? ...see Pastor Ben's article...

Desolation

- Turns us in on ourselves
- Drives us down the spiral ever deeper into our own negative feelings
- Cuts us off from community
- Makes us want to give up on the things that used to be important to us
- Takes over our whole consciousness and crowds out our distant vision
- Covers up all our landmarks [the signs of our journey with God so far]
- Drains us of energy

Consolation

- Directs our focus outside and beyond ourselves
- Lifts our hearts so that we can see the joys and sorrows of other people
- Bonds us more closely to our human community
- Generates new inspiration and ideas
- Restores balance and refreshes our inner vision
- Shows us where God is active in our lives and where God is leading us
- Releases new energy in us

Council met on Tuesday, September 19. Below are the highlights. You can find our minutes in the members section of our website.

- Our constitution is reviewed every 3 years. We have started the process to incorporate required edits from the ELCA and to review the Our Congregation section for any desired updates. If you are interested in reading and commenting on our constitution, please see Brooke or Linda

- The audit committee finished their audit of our 2022 records and found them to be in satisfactory condition. A couple of recommendations were given to make the process better.

- A Building Use booklet is in the works and we agreed that monies collected from the use of the building will go toward the building mortgage.

- We looked at a draft of the 2024 budget and will finalize at our October meeting

October, 2023 What's going on at Messiah? Children's

Children have a new opportunity beginning October 15. They will be with their families in the sanctuary until The Children's Sermon, after which they are dismissed to Sunday School. They return to the sanctuary during The Sharing of the Peace to celebrate Communion with all the church family.

Worshiping with children is often an exercise of patience. Bringing children to worship is similar to dining with the family. Even though manners may not always be elegant, we do it because our children are fully members of the family and they need to be fed. In the same manner, worship reminds them they are part of God's family; and, as they participate in their own way, they grow in their understanding of God's love while being fed in the language of worship.

The number 940 is the number of weekends from the time a child is born until they graduate from high school. When a child is in third grade, there are only 468 weekends left. In addition, research shows that most children form their idea of who God is and choose whether they will have a relationship with him before leaving fifth grade. These are important weekends for your children. We will be prepared and ready to help them discover and embrace a growing relationship with Jesus Christ.


CHIMES IN THE AIR
