

This month, our special offering will be going to a strange place. Tanks of gas, a few groceries, simple things.

The unexpected result of being able to meet people in their need is that I can ole hear a bit of their story and connect them with the love of Christ.


COUNCIL CORNER

Just a few of the folks who stayed for our potluck dinner following the service. Pastor had a special blessing of the backpacks and students who are returning to school.




The Diaper Report
