
Thank you, Mary Rooney for these recipes, Chocolate Covered Cherries from January's snack table, and an amazingly easy Cheese Ball she brought in December. Mary's mom has been making Chocolate Covered Cherries for as long as she can remember. Here is her original recipe, and Mary's explanation follows:

Chocolate Covered Cherries

(from my mom's kitchen and made for over 60 years!)

The photo shows my mom's recipe she typed up for a mail order thing she did for a while. But I will relate my adapted recipe. (I don't know about adding Sealing Wax to the chocolate to eat! I have heard it adds shine, but I don't use it.:))

- 1 C. Butter
- 1 Can Eagle Brand Sweetened Condensed Milk
- 3 Tblsp Light Corn Syrup

2-3 Lbs Powdered Sugar

About 200 Maraschino Cherries --large with stems (I usually get a 74 oz jar from Smart & Final)

Chocolate for dipping: I get many bars and mix all flavors (Dark chocolate, Baker's Chocolate, German Chocolate, unsweetened chocolate--Melting discs. I don't use chocolate chips or much milk chocolate. The better quality, the better!)

Set up:

Drain the cherries so they get fairly dry. Place wax paper on several baking sheets.

Melt butter then stir in liquids. Add powdered sugar slowly stirring and heating on very low heat. It will become a kind of sticky fondant. I have written myself a sticky note on the recipe that says "Fondant will try and trick you! Use NO MORE than 3 lbs of sugar, it will thicken as it cools." But maybe the original recipe is correct and it would be better to use more--up to 6 lbs?!

Take some of the warm fondant and put in a separate small bowl.

Take about a spoonful of fondant in your hands and roll into a ball, then flatten to a thin paste. Wrap the fondant around the dry-ish cherry. Continue wrapping the cherries until all are covered and sitting on the wax paper. If you need to, lightly reheat the fondant if it gets too crumbly. (There is a bit of a learning curve here--I still have not mastered the consistency)

I have a small crockpot that I heat my chocolate in, but a double boiler will work. Don't heat it too fast or it will get past a liquid dipping stage and start to crystallize. Stir often. When it is melted, take the cherries by the stem and dip into the chocolate. Place back on the wax paper. Toothpicks or a spoon can help dip cherries that might not have a stem. Let the chocolate set, then store in airtight container. They freeze well! Enjoy! I try and make these every year, so if anyone wants to have a dipping party next year, let me know! It is quite a process but so yummy and great for gift giving!

Mary's Cheese Ball


- 18 oz pkg Philly Cream Cheese, softened
- 1 pkg Budding sandwich ham, chopped
- 1 bunch Green onions, chopped
- 1 Tbsp Dried Chives, or Italian Seasoning

(I double this recipe)

Put all ingredients in Food processor and run until well blended. Take the mixture out of the processor and place on saran wrap. Use the wrap to form a ball. You can roll the ball in chopped nuts if you like. I did not do that step when I brought it to the Guild meeting.
