I want to share two recipes from our Holiday event. They were too delicious not to publish here. Here are Roberta Perpich's cranberry bliss bar recipe, and Lauren Goldfish's cranberry scone recipe link. Trish said that Roberta's bars tasted way better than Starbucks. I had several of them. Someone else mentioned they had never tasted such moist scones as Lauren's. Enjoy:

Cranberry Bliss Bars (From Roberta Perpich)

Preheat oven to 350 degrees, line a 9X13 sheet pan with parchment paper covering on sides for easy removal.

Ingredients for bars

- 1 cup butter melted (2 sticks)
- 1 1/2 cups packed brown sugar
- 2 eggs
- 1 teaspoon orange extract
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 1/2 teaspoon ginger
- 1 teaspoon baking powder

1/2 teaspoon salt

2 cups all-purpose flour

1 cup white chocolate chips 3/4/ cup dried cranberries

Beat together melted butter and brown sugar. Add eggs, orange and vanilla extract and beat until well mixed. Add dry ingredients (flour, baking powder, salt and ginger), beating until just blended. Stir in by hand white chocolate chips and dried cranberries. Pour into prepared pan and level. Bake for 18-22 minutes, until set and golden brown at the edges. DO NOT OVER BAKE. Remove from oven and cool completely on a baking rack before frosting.

Frosting

8 ounces cream cheese, softened

1 1/2 cups powdered sugar

1/2 teaspoon orange extract

1/2 teaspoon vanilla extract

1/2 cup roughly chopped dried cranberries

2 squares white baking chocolate or almond bark

Beat cream cheese and powdered sugar until smooth and creamy, add orange and vanilla extracts and mix well. Frost cooled bars, sprinkle with chopped dried cranberries and drizzle with melted white chocolate over the bars. Refrigerate for one hour for easy cutting.

Bars can be frozen up to 3 months by first refrigerating them for 4 hours. Cover tightly in a container that is covered tightly with plastic wrap and with foil. Thaw in refrigerator overnight before serving.

A Diné shepherd, fiber artist, teacher, storyteller, and photographer

Nikyle Begay (they/them) is a Diné shepherd, fiber artist, teacher, storyteller, and photographer based in Ganado,

Arizona on the Navajo Nation. Nikyle is the Executive Director of Rainbow Fiber Co-Op, a Co-Op that began in 2020 to improve the financial sustainability and equitable market outcomes for the remaining flocks of Navajo-Churro sheep on the Navajo Nation. Nikyle has experience working in technology and the nonprofit sector, as well as an extensive background in sheep flock management, wool production, traditional to modern wool processing, and the weaving arts. Nikyle is a member and registration inspector for the Navajo-Churro Sheep Association, where they continue to raise Navajo-Churro sheep, sheep that have shaped Navajo weaving throughout history. Nikyle still serves as an advisor to the Navajo-led organization, Diné be' iiná – Navajo Lifeway Inc. Diné be' iiná's mission is to preserve and promote both the traditional shepherding and weaving lifeways of the Diné people.
