Youth Silhouette Shoot



If you shoot the archery range, please shoot with care. As soon as the logging is completed, we will start restoring the range.

Timber Harvest Operations Underway

In recent years, the club hired Forester Brett Kuipers of Michigan Forestry Co. to develop a 20-year forest management plan for the club. The plan is focused on forestry activities that aim towards goals of a healthy forest and improved wildlife habitat. The overall Club property is divided into different management units based on our management goals and existing habitat or forest type. Some units will be on a long-term cycle of selective thinning, with either natural regrowth or replanting. Some areas will require tree and shrub plantings or invasive plant removal to diversify wildlife cover and food resources. Other areas, like wetlands, river or creek corridors, will be protected and left untouched.

One of the early actions in our Plan's schedule of activities was to address aged pines and thick aspen stands. Last winter, with guidance from our Forester, the Club signed a timber harvest contract to address these management units. Though winter would have been the ideal time to harvest, the weather was not conducive to allow heavy harvest machinery in without causing damage. The dry summer has left the ground hard enough to allow machinery access, and in early July, the loggers had an opening in their schedule and began harvest. The attached maps show the harvest plans.

The northern aspen area on the harvest map is being cut first. This will be a clear cut, which is a sustainable management method for aspen, specifically. This method allows for maximum seedling regeneration, as aspen thrive in full sunlight, regrowing via root suckers and can grow several feed in the first year. Other aspen areas in the contract will be addressed later in the season.

In addition to the aspen, loggers will also be thinning aging pine trees near the clubhouse road, which will help to avoid disease and pest issues and open the canopy to more sunlight and natural regrowth. With more sunlight on the forest floor, other seeds in the soil can germinate, allowing new seedlings to grow and increase diversity in the forest.

Next stages (hopefully late fall or winter) will include a hardwood thinning in the southeast portion of the property. Some of this area will have to be clear cut as well, as part of the long-distance rifle range development. Timing is important here, due to the the forest type. As our loggers are aware, a disease called oak wilt can easily spread if oak trees are cut or damaged (bark scraped or branches broken) during the months of about April - August. This disease eventually will kill oaks, and continue spreading through root grafts. Though we aim to cut hard maple (sugar maple) and oak trees are pretty limited on the property, we don't want to risk introducing this disease.

While these operations are actively underway, please be safe and keep clear! Do not approach machinery (while active or not), do not climb on log piles - they are not stable. Loggers are generally working Monday-Friday from about 7-4:30. The 3-D archery range is available for use outside of those time. For more information, contact your Conservation Committee!
