## Mason County 4-H Shooting Program

When people think about 4-H, one of the first things they think about, is animals at the county fair. While market livestock is definitely a big part of 4-H's identity and history, 4-H is a broad collection of programs that focus taking subjects that youth are interested in or adults are interested in teaching youth and using that passion to help them build life skills using those interests. For many youth and adults, their passions lay outdoors, in being a part of the rich hunting and fishing culture that is a part of the Great Lakes State. For many youth, learning how to responsibly handle a firearm and take part in shooting sports is a right of passage, one that we want to remain a part of the Mason County 4-H program. We had over 60 kids for a couple of years, and was one of the largest clubs in the county.

For several years, Mason County 4-H had the Mason County 4-H Shooting Sports program. A program in which the Fin and Feather has been a critical partner. All primary leaders of each discipline are required to be Members of F&F. All supplies belonging to 4-H are kept at the Fin and Feather Club. The 4-H Program is a collection of adults that wanted to instruct and guide youth in the fields of archery, hunting and wildlife, shotgun, and rifle. At one point, this program had almost 70 participants, making it one of the biggest in the county. But regrettably, the Pandemic made it difficult to operate. But, we feel that now is the time for Mason County 4-H to rebuild this program and see to it that, through participation in 4-H, youth are not only able to become responsible and caring members of the community, but responsible gun owners and caretakers of nature. To accomplish this goal, the first step is to recruit volunteers that are willing to work with these youth in these fields of study. Becoming a 4-H volunteer and shooting sports instructor is relatively simple. Volunteers simply need to complete an application to be a 4-H Volunteer and undergo a background check (a process usually taking about two weeks). Once that is complete, volunteers will need to undertake a certification class in one of the shooting sports areas (archery, hunting and wildlife, shotgun, or rifle). Michigan 4-H currently has a certification class scheduled for March 4<sup>th</sup> in Roscommon, MI. Certification class typically last the entire day.

The program is already very well funded and new leaders will be brought up to speed from previous leaders on bylaws, finances, etc. All that remains is for some interested adults to step forward to train the next generation of shooting sports enthusiasts.

## Range Safety Rules & Regulations

Over the last few months, we have had several reports made by various club members of unsafe practices occurring on the rifle ranges. Safety is our #1 priority and needs to happen at all times. Over the next several newsletters we will be reminding everyone of safety regulations and proper uses of our ranges. Below are some of the safety rules, plus several other items that need to be adhered to.

1. Shooting on the rifle range is to be done from the shooting benches or from a position parallel with the benches. **No shooting from in front of benches.** Do not move benches from their locations.
2. When putting up targets, all benches are to be cleared, actions on all guns open and no one is to touch their gun until everyone is back behind the shooting line, and the range has been verified safe to shoot.
3. Leave your guns cased until setting the shooting benches.
4. Absolutely **NO ONE** is to be down range when shooting.
5. Rapid fire is highly discouraged at the 100 yard range. (Too many reports of bullets going over the berm and off into the trees). The 50 yard range is better equipped to handle rapid fire
6. No portable targets on either rifle range. We have established target frames, use them. We have very nice pistol ranges for handgun shooting. The 50 yard was built for small bore rifle, not a handgun range. **DO NOT** drag portable stands down to this range.
7. No shotguns or handguns on the 100 yard range (slug guns and long-range hunting handguns will be permitted).

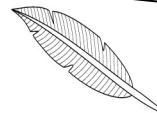

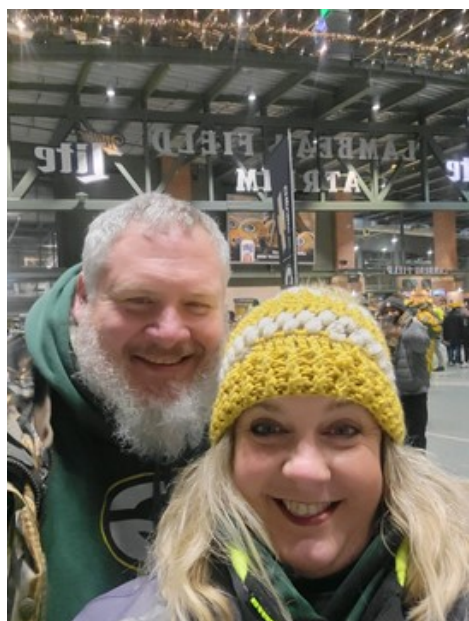
