The first Hunter Safety Class of the year was held April 15 & 16, 2023 at the Fin and Feather Club House. The main purpose of the hunter education course is to train safe, legal, and responsible hunters. The topics covered included understanding wildlife management, wildlife identification, ethics, laws and regulations, and firearms safety and handling. To receive a Hunter Safety certificate, the students had to attend both days, complete a written test, and pass the required field day. 44 students passed the course and received their certificate.

The next Hunter Safety class will be August 19th & 20, 2023. Again you must sign up thru [Michigan.storefront.kalkomey.com](https://michigan.storefront.kalkomey.com). The class will be posted sometime in July.

According to Michigan law, to purchase a hunting license in Michigan, all hunters who were born on or after January 1, 1960, must complete hunter education certification approved by the Michigan Department of Natural Resources and IHEA-USA.

MUSHROOM NATURE HIKE

Date and Location *Friday, May 26th, 2023, from 9:00am to ~12:00pm. At ~8:45am, meet at the Fin and Feather Club of Mason County, 3276 North Darr Road, Scottville, Michigan 49454 – the parking area is near the main building. We will walk various areas of the property and identify and discuss fungi we see along the way.

The hike is presented by Manistee and Mason-Lake Conservation Districts, Forestry Assistance Program (FAP), Linda Scribner, and Fin and Feather Club of Mason County. During this nature walk you will learn about different types of fungi (including mushrooms) growing in the forests of Michigan. Specific topics will include identification of wild fungi (including edible and non-edible species) and the basic biology of mushrooms and other fungi. We will also discuss the ecological importance of such fungi in the forest. This nature walk will take place at the Fin and Feather Club of Mason County and will be led by Josh Shields, FAP forester and wildlife biologist with the Manistee and Mason-Lake Conservation Districts, and Linda Scribner, a naturalist who received her Wild Mushroom Certification through Michigan Department of Agriculture and Rural Development (MDARD).
