

Faithful Friar's Report Msgr. Stephen Doktorczyk



Dear Brother Knights,

In September the Church celebrates two important feasts: that of the Triumph of the Holy Cross (on the 14th) followed by Our Lady of Sorrows on the 15th. They are interconnected. Though in the eyes of the world and to those present when Jesus was crucified, there was no triumph to celebrate, much less recognize. The profound love of Christ was manifested by his death on the cross, gruesome and bloody as it was. We can say that he conquered death with his resurrection. But there would be no Easter Sunday without Good Friday. In some of the more observant religious orders, September 14 marks the beginning of the great fast, which won't end until Easter Sunday and is only interrupted by liturgical solemnities, including Christmas and Mary, the Mother of God. The earlier Easter falls in a given year, the shorter the "great fast." Also remembered on this day is the finding of the True Cross in Jerusalem thanks to the efforts of (and expense incurred by) St. Helen, the mother of emperor Constantine, who in the early 300s arranged for the excavation of what was believed to be the cross of Christ. Three crosses were found at the end of the digging efforts. When a boy was clearly healed after making contact with the cross in the middle, Helena and others had no doubt that it was indeed the Cross on which Christ had been crucified.

Now on to the September 15 memorial: How much did Mary suffer when she was her son suffer such agonizing pain? She kept sorrows, joys, pains and other emotions "in her heart." The seven sorrows, in order, are: 1. Simeon announces the suffering destiny of Jesus (Luke 2:34-35); 2. Mary escapes into Egypt with Jesus and Joseph (Matt 2:13-15); 3. Mary seeks the boy Jesus who was lost in Jerusalem (Luke 2:41-51); 4. Mary meets Jesus as he carries his cross to Calvary (cf. Luke 23:26-31); 5. Mary stands near the Cross of her Son (John 19:25-27); 6. Mary receives into her arms the body of Jesus taken down from the Cross (cf. John 19:38); 7. Mary helps place the body of Jesus in the tomb (cf. John 19:39-42). What does this mean for us? Well, we are invited to unite our sufferings with those of Christ through our Mother Mary, who endured special suffering due to her role as Mother of God.

Celebrating these events in the middle of September in a way is a precursor to what is to come during Holy Week, including the invitation to recite the *Stabat Mater* (loosely translated as "the mother stood"). You will remember that we recite different verses of the hymn during stations of the cross on Fridays during Lent.

Though hopefully not sorrowful for any of you, I thank you all in advance for the involvement you will have at the Polish festival this weekend and Oktoberfest at the end of the month. May the Lord reward you for your goodness.

Pope Francis reflections on Love, Reconciliation, and helping others Change their Ways.

To dialogue with someone who has wronged us is a process that requires "real courage," Pope Francis said Sunday, reflecting on the theme of "fraternal correction."



In Sunday's Gospel reading (Mt 18:15-20) Jesus says: "If your brother sins against you, go and tell him his fault between you and him alone. If he listens to you, you have won over your brother."

Fraternal correction is "one of the highest expressions of love, and also the most demanding, because it is not easy to correct others," the Holy Father observed, speaking on Sept. 10 from a window at the Apostolic Palace to pilgrims gathered in St. Peter's Square. "When a brother in the faith commits a fault against you, you, without rancor, help him, correct him: Help by correcting."

The pope went on to condemn gossip, or "chattering," which is "not right" and is "not pleasing to God." He called gossip "a plague on the lives of people and communities because it brings division, it brings suffering, it brings scandal, and it never helps to improve, it never helps to grow."

Fraternal correction, on the other hand, is a process that allows us to help the other person "understand where he is wrong. And do this for his good, overcoming shame and finding true courage, which is not to speak badly, but to say things to his face with meekness and kindness," Pope Francis said. But he warned that "pointing the finger" at the other's fault "is not good, in fact, it often makes it more difficult for those who made a mistake to recognize their mistake."

"But we might ask, what if this is not enough? What if he does not understand?" the pope asked.

"Then we must look for help. Beware, though: not from the group that gossips! Jesus says: 'Take one or two others along with you,' meaning people who genuinely want to lend a hand to this misguided brother," Francis urged.

"And if he still does not understand? Then, Jesus says, involve the community. But here, too, this does not mean to pillory a person, putting him to shame publicly, but rather to unite the efforts of everyone to help him change," the pope said.

"And so, let us ask ourselves: How should I behave with a person who wrongs me? Do I keep it inside and accumulate resentment?" Pope Francis asked. "Do I talk about it behind their backs? 'Do you know what he did?' and so on. Or am I brave, courageous, and do I try to talk about it to him or her? Do I pray for him or her, ask for help to do good? And do our communities take care of those who fall so that they can get back up and start a new life? Do they point their fingers or open their arms?"

The pope asked again: "What do you do: Do you point the finger or open your arms?"




