Quick Tips for Cracking the Code

1. Do not read any words or ask students to read words until you complete Level 7

2. Lesson 1:

- a. Demonstrate what to look for, what to say when it is found, and how to mark
- b. Practice with the students as a team, until they have mastered see, say and do
- c. Workbook exercise is for students to show they have mastered the pattern independently

3. Lesson 2:

- Demonstrate how to do the pattern with speed
- b. Practice with the students, as a team, until they have speed and accuracy
- c. Workbook exercise is for students to show they have mastered the pattern independently

4. Lesson 3:

- a. Review to make sure they have completed the purpose see, say and do for the pattern
- b. Practice to ensure accuracy and speed.
- c. Workbook exercise is the team's way to show they have it. If one or more makes a mistake, they all do the additional practice sheets until they have mastery

5. Remember:

- a. Keep putting words up on the board until students have mastered the level
- b. A lesson lasts as long as the students need to master the level
- Use the Progress Chart to keep track of how students are doing. Too many redos mean you are not giving enough time for practice
- d. When you complete the program, students need time to practice using the entire system. We have lessons at turninganewpage.com.
- e. After completing the program, make sure you teach if they know the word, they do not mark it.

 Only mark words they do not recognize.
