

Hello, Millview Members!

Before reading and signing the Millview Club Terms and Conditions, we wanted to give a brief description to explain what Millview Swim Club is, what it is not, and how it is operated.

## **WHO ARE WE?**

1. The Millview Community Club began in the 1970s as a community club for the (comparatively few and spread-out) families in this area who wanted to get together to socialize (think holiday potlucks and fish-frys). In 1980, these families pooled their own money and manpower to build a pool and thus became the Millview Swim Club.
2. Millview is a “not for profit” organization that receives no financial assistance from the city, county or state. We depend on participation and help from members to make the workload light and keep Millview beautiful, safe and fun.
3. This is a volunteer organization. The overseeing board does not get paid for their service to Millview, but does receive a discount on membership dues the following year (See #5).
4. The board of directors is made up of a president, vice-president, treasurer, and secretary. We ask for a two-year commitment from each of them. Additional coordinators and volunteers help manage specific areas of the pool (like maintenance, lifeguards, member events, etc). Each elected board member spends dozens of hours on pool-related decisions and improvements during a calendar year.
5. After serving on the board for one year, active and effective board members may receive a \$100 membership discount, and the president may receive a full membership.

## **Millview Swim Club Terms and Conditions**

Failure to abide by these rules could result in losing one’s membership without refund.

All members, employees and guests are to maintain the safest environment possible. To this end, everyone must agree to and abide by the following rules posted on our website, as well as any posted on the property.

## Grounds/Facility Rules

- Only members of Millview Swim Club are allowed to utilize Millview Swim Club facilities, unless visiting as a guest of a member or renting the clubhouse as a non-member.
- Anyone, members included, found on the property after hours without permission will also be considered trespassing.
- All solicitation is prohibited.
- Improper or unsafe use of any Millview facility will be grounds for removal from the property.
- Please respect your community club by picking up your own trash.
- The phone is for emergency use only.

## Code of Conduct

The following actions are prohibited and are grounds for removal from the property:

- Alcohol or illegal drug use
- Smoking or vaping
- Public profanity
- Disrespect to lifeguards and/or defying or deliberately ignoring their instructions

Note: Lifeguards are charged with the responsibility of enforcing the rules and may request anyone violating the code of conduct to leave the property.

## Membership & Guest Policies

- Only family members living in the same household share privileges of membership.
- Members are limited to five (5) guests per visit, if those guests are not from one single family.
- **Guest fee is \$5.00 per person** per visit, with a maximum of \$25 for a family. **Guests may visit Millview Pool a maximum of 5 times** during the summer. Please encourage friends to join Millview!
- Please be sure to sign the member log-in register each day.
- Swimming attire only; cutoffs are prohibited.
- **Please make sure swimsuits are pool-use only.** Algae/mold problems can be caused by contamination from creeks, lakes, etc. Please wash your suits after creek/lake use.
- The music played at Millview is selected with a family community in mind. No vulgar or obscene lyrics will be tolerated.
- Membership implies consent for photos to be placed on MillviewSwimClub.com unless written refusal (via email) is provided within one week of purchasing your membership.

## Child Safety Policies

- **Children under the age of 12 need to have a parent or guardian with them at all times** inside or outside the pool area.
- Lifeguards are on duty; however, **it is the ultimate responsibility of parent(s) to ensure safety of your child and your guests.**
- Use of Baby Pool is restricted to children 4 years of age and under along with their parent or caregiver, even during breaks.
- Lifeguards may, at their discretion, require a swim proficiency test for any age swimmer.

## Gate-Key Rules

- Each member family is granted one gate key, no exceptions.
- Admittance to pool requires member's key. This is proof of membership. Lifeguards are not to abandon their posts to let members in if they forget their key.
- Keys are never to be given to any non-members, except in the case of baby-sitters bringing members' children.
- There is a \$50 fee to replace a lost key.

## Pool-Hours Policies

- Hours of operation will be maintained on the website, and are subject to change throughout the season as determined by the Millview Board of Directors. Hours may be increased, decreased, or shifted depending on input, available funds, or trends of use from members.
- If no members are present one half-hour before closing, the lifeguard may elect to shut the pool down 30 minutes early.
- Hours subject to change in inclement weather; closing the pool is at the discretion of the Board.
- Hours will change when Williamson County Schools open in August. Depending on weather, member interest, and lifeguard availability, the pool might stay open past Labor Day.

## **POOL RULES**

1. No running on the pool deck.
2. No chicken fights or rough horseplay.
3. No food, glass bottles, or open drink containers in the pool area.
4. No profanity.
5. Swim diapers are required for young children who are not fully potty-trained.
6. No floating devices in the deep end.
7. No diving in the shallow end.
8. Diving Board Policy: Only one person on the diving board at a time. The person diving in must swim to the sides where the ladders are, and the following diver must wait until area in front of the diving board is clear.
9. The lifeguard stands are for the lifeguards alone.
10. No "dead man's float" when pool is crowded. Back dives and flips are allowed at the discretion of the lifeguard(s).
11. In case of lightning, all members must leave the fenced pool area until there has been no thunder for thirty minutes. Members may wait under the pavilion.
12. Treat the lifeguards with kindness and respect and follow their instructions. They are here for our safety!
