SNAPSHOT

MACH's one-day 2018 results:

- » 1,205 people identified as experiencing homelessness across the 14 counties
- » 200 individuals were unsheltered
- » 251 adults and children were in families (21% of total count)
- » 248 were chronically homeless individuals (21% of total count)
- » 146 were veterans (12% of adults)

DID YOU KNOW?

There are roughly 4,000 people homeless in SC (this number only reflects people that agreed to be counted). More than 10% are under the age of 18. Veterans make up 415 of that number and another 255 are mentally ill. The numbers increase dramatically when you look at the US as a whole.

There are not nearly enough shelters to house the homeless. Many homeless people feel safer on the streets than in a shelter.

The number of students in kindergarten through the 12th grade who are homeless has increased by 70 percent over the last decade, according to new federal data that also suggests it shows no signs of slowing.

In a recent survey asking the homeless how they survive on the streets with little to no money. The top answer was by far the \$1 menu at McDonald's.

Domestic violence is the leading cause of homelessness amongst women

Many people are homeless because they don't earn enough money to cover the cost of rent.

On average there is only enough public rental assistance to help about one out of every four extremely low-income households. Those who do not receive help are on multi-year waiting lists. Yet many cities are increasingly making homelessness a crime.

One in five homeless people suffers from untreated severe mental illness.

There are more federal grants available for arts and various beautification projects than there are to feed the hungry or house the homeless
