MINUTES OF THE VILLAGE OF MESICK DECEMBER 14, 2016

PRESIDENT HOWELL OPENED THE MEETING AT 7:00 P.M.

COGER ASKED THAT THE VILLAGE REPLACE THE CULVERT AT THE END OF WEST EDWARD STREET, THE CULVERT AREA ISN'T WIDE ENOUGH AND THE PLOW TRUCK TIRES ARE GOING INTO THE DITCH. ALSO, HE INDICATED THAT THERE IS STANDING WATER IN THE TURN AROUND, WAS A METER PUT IN AT THE END OF THE LINE DURING THE NEW CONSTRUCTION?

MOTION BY SMITH SUPPORTED BY BURROUGHS TO PAY AN OVERAGE TO CONSUMERS ENERGY OUT OF THE WATER FUND IN THE AMOUNT OF \$2784.00 (TWO THOUSAND SEVEN HUNDRED EIGHTY FOUR DOLLARS) FOR THE POWER NEEDED AT THE PUMP HOUSE IN THE RURAL DEVELOPMENT PROJECT. ALL IN FAVOR; MOTION CARRIED.

BRIAN ROWLEY UPDATED THE VILLAGE REGARDING THE WATER PROJECT ON 16 ROAD THE ESTIMATED COST WILL BE \$60,000.00 AND THE VILLAGE COULD HAVE A POSSIBILITY OF THREE HOOK-UPS. THEY WANT TO START IN MAY.

HAGGERTY AGREED TO HOOK-UP TO THE 2" LINE OWNED BY PASTOR LOW UNTIL THE 16 ROAD PROJECT IS COMPLETE. SHE ALSO WOULD LIKE TO BUILD A GARAGE AND BREEZEWAY IN THE SPRING. HEYMES WILL MEET WITH HER AND ASSURE THE PLACEMENT OF THE WATER LINE BEFORE SHE ASKS FOR A BUILDING PERMIT.

MOTION BY SCHAEFER SUPPORTED BY BURROUGHS TO USE PROJECT MONEY TO PAY FOR BILLINGS FOR \$95,523.23 (MINTY FIVE THOUSAND FIVE HUNDRED TWENTY THREE DOLLARS AND TWENTY THREE CENTS) ALL IN FAVOR; MOTION CARRIED.

MOTION BY CARLSEN SUPPORTED BY CLOUS TO APPROVE THE REGULAR MEETING MINUTES. ALL IN FAVOR; MOTION CARRIED.

MOTION BY CLOUS SUPPORTED BY SCHAEFER TO APPROVE THE CLOSED SESSION MINUTES OF THE NOVEMBER 9, 2016 MEETING. ALL IN FAVOR; MOTION CARRIED. THE CLOSED SESSION MINUTES OF THE BOARD MEMBERS WERE GIVEN TO STANTON. SMITH WILL BRING HIS IN NEXT MEETING.

MOTION BY BESAW SUPPORTED BY CLOUS TO EXCEPT THE PROPOSAL SUBMITTED BY HEYMES FROM LAKE LAND AND MANAGEMENT CORPORATION FOR WEED TREATMENT AT THE LAGOONS NOT TO EXCEED \$5000.00 FOR THE FIRST TREATMENT AND NOT TO TREAT THE SECOND TIME WITHOUT PERMISSION. ALL IN FAVOR; MOTION CARRIED.

MCLEOD SUBMITTED A BUDGET FOR THE COUNCIL TO REVIEW UNTIL THE NEXT MEETING.

THE COUNCIL PAYS \$1200.00 A YEAR FOR THE SEWER ASSESSMENT OF THE MUSEUM.

WHEN THE COUNCIL SOLD THE PROPERTY ON JOHN STREET TO PAMELA STOMMELL THE SEWER ASSESSMENT WAS NOT INCLUDED THE COUNCIL INSTRUCTED MCLEOD TO SUBMIT THE BILL TO STOMMELL.

MOTION BY SMITH SUPPORTED BY BURROUGHS TO APPROVE THE BILLS AS READ. ALL IN FAVOR; MOTION CARRIED.

THE COUNCIL WILL SUBMITT AN INSURANCE CLAIM ONCE THEY RECEIVE A BILL FROM ALPINE ELECTRIC FOR THE DIALER THAT WAS BURNT UP IN THE ELECTRICAL OUTAGE, DECEMBER 4, 2016.

MOTION BY CARLSEN SUPPORTED BY BURROUGHS TO ADJOURN THE MEETING AT 7:50 P.M. ALL IN FAVOR; MOTION CARRIED.
