
# Christian Education at Beaver Creek Cumberland Presbyterian Church

# **CHILDREN'S MINISTRY**

<u>Sunday school</u>: We offer classes for children ages 2 years old through 5th grade. These classes meet in the education wing of the main church building

**Nursery:** We provide childcare during both worship services, Sunday school, Wednesday evening activities, and as needed for other church functions. We have an infant nursery for children birth through 2 years old, and a toddler nursery for children 2 through 5 years old. The nurseries are located downstairs in the education wing of the main church building.

**Wonderful Wednesdays:** These meetings are from August through May. This program begins at 6:00 PM and consists of service projects, Christian education activities, including Bible, a library visit, choir (4 years – 5<sup>th</sup> grade) crafts, singing with Pastor Thomas & friends, and recreation. We also offer a Wednesday evening meal beginning at 5:00 in the fellowship hall for anyone who wishes to attend. The price of the meal is \$3.00 children, \$5.00 adults and youth, with a maximum of \$20.00 per family.

<u>Vacation Bible School</u>: Five evenings each summer, we host a community-wide Bible school for preschoolers and elementary students. During this fun and exciting event, children rotate to various activity stations such as music, Bible stories, snacks, crafts, and games. For children ages 4 through those completing 5<sup>th</sup> grade.

Other activities: The children also have other planned activities including a lock-ins held in the Family Life Center and a "Birthday Party for Jesus" - an annual celebration in a child-friendly learning center format of Christmas traditions, insights and understandings, enabling children to experience the "reason for the season" in a grand Wednesday night celebration in December. The kids also go caroling to local church members houses on this evening.

Volunteer Opportunities: It takes many dedicated people to create a ministry that meets the needs of our children and families. We are always seeking people who are capable of loving, listening, and respecting our children's uniqueness as children of God. # **YOUTH MINISTRY**

#### **Youth Sunday School:**

We offer two Sunday school classes for youth.

The first class is for <u>middle school</u>, <u>students in 6<sup>th</sup>-8<sup>th</sup> grade</u>. The middle school classroom is located in the upper level of the Family Life Center and is taught by Cindy Scott. The curriculum focus varies from season to season.

The second class is for <u>high school students</u>, <u>grades 9</u> through 12. The high school classroom is located in the upper level of the Family Life Center. This class is currently taught by Rev. Billy Price and Brandi Smith. This class is a more in-depth study of scripture and discipleship focus than the middle school class.

<u>College and Career Class:</u> We have a class for collegeage youth and this class meets in the youth area in the Family Life Center. Kathy Stover is the teacher of this class.

#### **Wednesday Nights:**

The middle of the week gathering involves both middle and high school students together. We meet from 6:00 p.m. -7:45 p.m. in the youth area that is in the upstairs of the Family Life Center. We have no set formal agenda, but there will always be some type of biblical teaching/learning. In this setting, we use a variety of teaching styles: listening, reading, discussing, creating,

media, and activities. There are prayer times and play times. We often break into smaller groups for discussion and presentations. This time frame is led by the youth minister and other volunteer leaders.

#### **Other Youth Ministry Opportunities:**

Our growth and faith in Christ is nurtured throughout the year through various events and activities. We serve somewhere locally once a month to keep servanthood always before us. We take a summer youth serve trip somewhere each summer for a week. There are a few weekend retreats that we take each year: a fall and spring middle school retreat and a fall and spring high school retreat. We also attend Presbyterial summer camps for middle schoolers and high schoolers. We encourage high schoolers to attend the denominational Cumberland Presbyterian Youth Conference (CPYC).

There are a variety of other events and activities we do throughout the year that are intentional for growth, discipleship, and even fun. In all that we plan and do together, we desire to learn and grow in our relationship with Jesus Christ and discover the life Christ has for us.

#### **Other Young Adult Ministry Opportunities**

The Young Adult Ministry is a relatively new ministry, so we are still trying to grow in our opportunities. We have no set formal agenda, but our focus together is to create a healthy and long-lasting community. To do this, we sometimes study a book of the Bible, a book written by relevant authors, or a video study. At times, we may also choose to share a meal together, get together for some recreation, or get together simply to hang out with one another. Activities in the past have included playing volleyball, playing disc golf, going to the fair, watching a movie, having a bonfire, etc. We enjoy spending time together and tend to make all decisions for our activities as a group. Some of the things the group has already been involved in have proven to be very fruitful. At times, we may attend retreats together or share information about denominational Young Adult conferences. At times, we will serve in local ministries in Knoxville.

## **OPPORTUNITIES FOR BIBLE STUDY**

We have a fall and spring Bible study running 4-6 weeks. The format is usually a video with a workbook and time for discussion. These sessions are on Sunday night from 5:30 – 6:30 p.m. The study and video is also available on Wednesday nights from 6:00-7:00 p.m. The group selects the topic for the studies. We also have a Bible Study during the Lenten Season on Wednesday evenings from 5:45-6:45.

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# THE BEAVER CREEK CHURCH LIBRARY OPPORTUNITIES

The mission of the Beaver Creek Cumberland Presbyterian Church Library is to provide up-to-date materials that promote Christian Education.

Library hours are every Sunday 8 a.m. – noon, with staff available 8:00-9:00 a.m., and 10:45-11:00 a.m. The library is located just across from the sanctuary, Room A111.
