Our foundation logo has the old wooden cross and a bright red heart. I wear a gold cross; I refuse to ever take it off. Even prior to a surgery I remember saying to the surgeon, "the cross stays no matter what". If I am to be perfectly honest, the cross has always been a bit of a stumbling block for me. Over the past 6 years of learning, submitting, reading, even sharing testimonies, I struggle.

One day while getting dressed I saw my gold heart in the mirror and I remembered a little silver heart my dad had given me as a young adolescent. Immediately, I thought the heart should go with the cross. Well, we had some technical difficulties; my childhood silver cross quickly turned black. That black heart and gold cross just didn't work; I saw the darkness. Fortunately, my lovely husband was able to have that same heart made of gold. For me, this completes the message I want to convey while I am wearing the cross of Jesus. It was His great love for me and for you that gave him the courage to endure the cross.

When I look in the mirror now, I know that the cross represents a profound love that is still shrouded in mystery for me, but it is the love that enables me to love. I realize the gift of love to a much greater degree when God blessed me with those February babies too!

So, for me this month is about love, but not the love of cupid and his arrows but the life-giving love of Jesus. In the First Epistle of John (4:19), the reflexive nature of this love is highlighted: "We love, because he first loved us", expressing the love of Christ as a mirroring of Christ's own love. LLP Healing Prayer Services Are Now In-person Twice a Month (1st and 3rd Tuesdays)



A friend and I went to a healing prayer service last night for the first time in a long time. We got there late, sat down, had communion and then heard a lady sing a song that brought me to tears; I remembered the feeling I used to get when attending these healing prayer services.

Goosebumps are Jesus' way of showing me he is near. I was covered in them as this lady continued to sing. My eyes were closed and my brother, who passed away a few years ago, showed up to the left of me and leaned his body on my shoulder like he was happy I was there. He didn't leave my side the entire song. I love seeing my brother.

After the song, soaking music started, and a prayer minister came over and asked if there was anything I wanted prayer for. I told her about my brother's appearance and we both thanked Jesus. I then asked her to pray for physical healing for sciatica that had been bothering me for about 3 years. Daily, I would feel shooting pain on my right side. Walking in parking lots I would freeze because it would feel like an electric shock.

We prayed. I had never asked for physical healing because I thought it would not happen for me. But it did. Immediately after prayer my hips were light, relaxed and I could move around with zero pain. Today, about 16 hours later, I am still pain free! Hallelujah. I am in awe of how good Jesus is. Jesus still heals today!

I told my friend that we should start attending the LLP healing prayer service every 1st Tuesday of the month. She agreed!

We discussed El-Shaddai, the strong one and the nourisher, then we prayed for others.


After we soaked in the love of Jesus with quiet music, Nancy and Kathleen shared that the glory cloud had descended upon the entire group.
