DID YOU KNOW?

Lo sapevate?

The year 1254 saw the birth of one of the world's most daring explorers. Marco Polo grew up in Venice and from there famously travelled to Asia along the Silk Road. His adventures lasted a quarter of a century, during which time he became a confidant of Kublai Khan. His departure from the Mongol Empire was permitted only to escort Princess Kokachin to Persia to be married. Only 18 people survived the two-year long journey, on which they had set out with100 ships and 600 crew and passengers. Thankfully, Marco Polo and the Princess were among them.

Upon his return to Venice, Marco joined the war against Genoa, where he was captured and imprisoned. While in prison, he recounted his adventures to fellow inmate and romance writer Rustichello of Pisa, who put the stories to paper. The Travels of Marco Polo quickly

became Europe's most popular book and made Marco Polo an instant celebrity. People were captivated by the exotic customs of the Far East, but many readers found the stories difficult to believe. The book soon became to be known as *Il Milione* (lit. "The Million" – *A Million Lies*).

After his release in 1299, Marco Polo returned to Venice, where he married, had three daughters, and continued to work in the family business until his death on January 8, 1324. The stories of Marco Polo inspired many explorers including Christopher Columbus, who set sail in 1492 with a copy of *The Travels of Marco Polo* in hand.
