


Celebration time for Renmore thanks to Walsh's late goal

THE champagne had already been taken out of the ice bucket and was ready to to go back into the press to await another suitable occasion as the home side trailed 2-1.

Over the years Renmore had suffered some cruel setbacks and at some stage fate had to deal a kind hand to them. The huge crowd waited with bated breath as the watch ran well into injury time when Hibernians conceded a needless free kick on half way.
