Their downfall essentially centred around their inflexibility for they were unable to produce a counter play when it became apparent that Castlegar had closed down the middle of the field, but matters were not helped by eight first half wides which, had some of them been scores, might have generated sufficient confidence to

make a battle out of the second half instead of the cake walk it became. A few of their players emerged with reputations enhanced, however, particularly goalie Jimmy Hughes — arguably the most consistent 'keeper in the entire championship — who can take pride from the fact that Castlegar for all their second half command failed to get a shot past him.

Team captain Malachy Hanley was also highly industrious at left half back and had reason to feel let-down by the poor use made of his deliveries by the attack, while at midfield James Walsh worked diligently throughout and made it a more difficult day for the Castlegar midfielders than for most of their colleagues.

Of the remainder, corner back Michael Sheridan, who was caught a bit flat-footed at times in the first half, recovered well after the interval while, in contrast Michael Lennihan who had a fair opening half, had a disastrous third quarter. Sean Murphy's game improved marginally when he moved to midfield before the break but his contribution was way short of expectations.

The National B.L.O.E. Track and Field Championships for boys and girls under 15, 16 and 17 were held last Saturday and Sunday at the Tullamore Harrier complex.

The Pearse Athletic Club sent a small contingent of athletes to these championships and they returned home with their share of the spoils.

In the girls under-15 age group Lorraine Begley proved very successful in the 800 metres where she took the bronze medal in a time of 2 minutes 18 seconds on the first day of the championships.
