

Provide patient employment and skills development, that helps people overcome employment barriers, generate income, and progress toward independence

The ROI of investing in the transformation model Housing → Development → Social Enterprise

\$53,144 per person per year*

= annual Tax Payer / Public cost of supporting a person experiencing homelessness

- Substance use treatment
- Shelter stays
- Ambulancé service
- ER visits
- Hospital stays
- Police calls, wellness checks
- Court appearances
- Jail stays / incarceration
- Social development





\$28 million 5-Year Net Benefit

From Cost → Contributor

~140 people

Annual Public Cost Savings = \$7.6 million / year

Plus, earned income potential

\$1million / year, by moving ~40 people to income earners
