The Twin Cities' Gay Men's' Chorus, joined by the James Sewell Ballet, performed the world premier of the powerful and haunting song cycle, Metamorphosis, in Minneapolis on March 19-20, 2004. The work was commissioned by TCGMC member Dwight Joyner and his father, Orlyn, to honor Dwight's brother Blake (1954-2000). These brothers did not have an easy relationship. They traveled widely divergent paths, sometimes embroiled in animosity because of Blake's hostile disdain for his gay brother. But the twists and turns of life made that all different. Blake's heart gave out. He was dying, and they both were forever changed by that brutal fact. Dwight wrote in TCGMC's concert program notes: "Through the sudden fear of potential death we embraced each other and learned that our love need not be withheld by differences." Metamorphosis is a song cycle about brothers, both born of blood and newly chosen in life. And it is about change that makes a real difference, even in the broken world of a family long divided. In the summary words of TCGMC Artistic Director, Stan Hill: "It is the hope of the men of the Twin Cities Gay Men's Chorus that in these words and in these melodies you find catharsis, healing, release, affirmation and love. That is why we commissioned it; that is why we sing it. If we don't tell our story, who will?"
