### A PARTING MESSAGE FROM THE GRAND KNIGHT

Since I'm a short-timer our editor asked me to recap the past 3 years and thanks to your efforts we accomplished a lot. For starters we moved our meeting location 5 TIMES (last 2 under me), from Griffin Road to the St Paul social hall, then to the room next to the Thrift Store, then to the McGivney center behind the church and finally to

the BMMMC. Despite all the turmoil we continued supporting our Pastor and parish while working hand in glove with our Auxiliary. At the BMMMC we added a big screen TV and AC unit to help with meetings. Also, to help with name recognition we started a picture wall with the name and photo of each active Knight. In the lobby we put up activity pictures and thanks to Mark O. and younger Mark O's efforts we have a glass case displaying historic 4<sup>th</sup> Degree regalia. Thanks to Tom and Doug we have high end grills to meet our cookout needs.

Starting the Pumpkin patch and continued by Allen was a lot of work, but it was one money raising activity that kept us afloat despite Covid restrictions. The Pumpkin Patch also helped Brothers get to know each other better, especially during slow pumpkin sales. It also spawned our noticeable red vests that have given us better visibility in church and parish activities. (My favorite photo is the one Mark O. took of the three Knights at church.)

Speaking of Church, we supported our Church and School in many ways: the Silver Rose, the St. Joseph icon, Respect Life, partially funded an ultrasound machine, provided Scholarships, drove Fr. Smolley, the booklet kiosk, built a ceremonial canopy on very short notice for the Christ the King celebration, helped with the FORMED program, and ultimately delivered the REVIVE and RETURN program that was so successful that the Parish is doing it again next year. We did a lot of cooking for Church festivals, mother/son day, Lenten Fish Fries, Trunk or Treat and our own events. We even did training on Flag raising and lowering etiquette, supported the science fair, and helped the Troops of St George.

And to top all that, we pushed the Yellow Dot Program, did several fundraisers for Citizens with Intellectual Disabilities and the Lake

Hills School, bought Coats for Kids, and provided direct support of the Special Olympics

and helped disabled veterans.

One of the factors that weighed heavily on Connie's and my mind against moving are all the great friends we made here at St. Paul. And as I would tell any potential new Brother, "The Council is very unusual in that there is not one pompous ass in the group, just a bunch of decent men living out their Catholic faith." Vivat Jesu!




