President's Message John Erickson

I became a member of the PSLOS in March 2013 and have volunteered for each subsequent orchid show. After our most recent show, I reflected back and came to the conclusion that this year's show was the best in the last 12 years. I have four reasons for making that statement.

REASON #1: LEADERSHIP. I estimate that Andrea Heitfeld put in over 200 hours planning and preparing for the show. She was also in charge of every aspect at the show.

REASON #2: LOCATION. The Polish American Club has several advantages over other recent venues. (a) There is no need for security. If we had held the show at the Port St. Lucie Botanical Gardens, we would have had to pay \$900 for police security on Friday and Saturday nights. (b) The show can't be affected by the heat or bad weather. In 2019, it rained one afternoon, affecting both attendance and sales. (c) Vendors don't need to bring tents, tables, and chairs.

REASON #3: MEMBERSHIP PARTICIPATION. Volunteers stepped up to: (a) donate a record 51 raffle baskets which surpassed the previous record by 19%; (b) enter a record number of niche displays which was made possible by the addition of a new large (12 inch) niche box; (c) donate/prepare food for breakfast/lunch for three days. Barbara Lynn has been preparing her chicken casserole since 2019, and it continues to be the hit of the show.

REASON #4: VENDOR SATISFACTION. Vendors agreed that sales exceeded expectations, and they were eager to participate again in the future.

The membership participation at the Orchid Show this year was OUTSTANDING, THE BEST EVER!

I have been growing orchids most of my life and have been fortunate enough to receive several AOS awards and register several of my hybrids. The greatest satisfaction for me is to have one of my hybrids awarded.

I began growing orchids in the late 60's after several years of tagging along with my father to visit his friend's greenhouses. Some of these growers were prominent growers in the area, and some of you may remember them: Jack Sweet, Cliff Curry, John Matthews, John & Gloria Naugle, etc. I began to receive a few back bulbs from some of these folks, and a few of them lived. I was off to the races after that. I built my first flask box when I was in high school.

I grew up on 1800 acres of family-owned ranch land. I started working on cattle ranches in the 70's and became familiar with Florida cypress swamps, greatly enjoying my adventures in these wonderful swamps. They became my refuge, and I always had the sense of traveling back hundreds of years in time when I entered one of these untouched places. I was able to find many of the Florida orchid species along with native ferns. Now I am older than dirt and I am still fascinated with orchids. Somewhere back in my memory, I am still a young man on an afternoon adventure in a pristine Florida cypress head, oak hammock, or creek bottom.



What a busy month April was! Our show was an INCREDIBLE success. We took in \$8.428.01 and spent \$4,566.60 (most of the expense was due to the facility rental), giving us a profit of \$3,861.41. Compared to 2023, income was \$5.958.00 and expenses were \$4,593.59, giving us a profit of \$1,364.41. What an incredible difference a year makes! Our raffles and admissions did so much better as did our trophy sponsorship.

Other business; we received an anonymous donation of \$1,000.00. Our picnic income was \$357.00 (includes \$112.00 raffle), and our expenses were \$162.41 (includes facility rental).

Tasks for May

May Climate Data

Average high: 87.2 Average low: 72 Average mean: 79.6 • Average rainfall: 5.52"



- Water heavily when you water; then dry hard to encourage new growths.
- Fertilize with up to 2 tsp. of 15-5-15 per gal of water every week or so. Alternate with Epsom salts and potassium nitrate at 1 tbs. each per gal. Do not "water before fertilizing" as it's a recipe for over watering.
- Continue all your repotting this month. Recently acquired plants in sphagnum MUST be repotted annually. Choose a more durable media such as rock, red wood chips or various mixtures to avoid this annual ritual.
- Re-set vandaceous orchids whose baskets have deteriorated or that have grown too tall to be easily managed. Keikies (off-shoots) can be most safely removed now.
- Follow good cultural practices: adequate spacing, brisk air movement, the strongest possible light, combined with careful watering to minimize fungi.
- Use systemic fungicides when necessary for black rot and crown rot.

DECODING TAGS

When you are decoding the information on the tag of an orchid:

- 1. All orchids belong to the family <u>Orchidaceae</u> (pronounced "or-kid-DAY-see-ee)."
 2. Within the family are many <u>genera</u>. In an orchid name, the genus comes first (ex.-
- Cattleya, Dendrobium, Phaleanopsis, and many more). The genus is capitalized.

 3. Then comes <u>species</u>. A species is a member of a genus. There are many species within each genus.

<u>Species</u> - may also refer to plants that originated in nature, even if they are now propagated in cultivation. It can be found in the wild and was not created by humans. A species is always indicated by a lower case letter (Ex. Cattleya triani).





<u>Hybrids</u> - may be made by nature but most have been created by humans. This name also occurs after genus, if it isn't a species, but is indicated with a capital letter (ex. Cattleya Doris and Byron). This name applies to every seedling that results from this particular cross and all future crosses of the same parents. There are bigeneric and multi generic hybrids.

<u>Clonal names</u> - can be given by a hybridizer or another owner to a plant and all of its divisions. (ex. *Paphiopedilum* Jim Kie 'Springwater').



The originator who produces and first flowers a new hybrid may name and register it with the Royal Horticultural Society, London, the International Registration Authority for Orchids.

A <u>specimen</u> plant is a mature plant that carries a spectacular number of flowers, preferably so uniformly distributed that the plant is covered with blooms.
