Nor cease to yield fruit.

- Sarah has her maid have a son with Abraham because she did not wait for God. Then Sarah has Isaac, the son of the promise.
- Isaac is a more passive guy. Moves along to get along (conflict avoidance).
- Rebekah is more of a take charge woman, quick decision, quick action, get it done now.
- Esau is the older of fraternal twin brother Jacob (heel-grabber, supplanter, crooked).
- Father loves Esau. Rebekah. who is told that the younger will serve the older, loves Jacob.
- Jacob manipulates Esau with a bowl of bean soup, gains the birthright, which Esau has despised.
- Rebekah and Jacob deceive Isaac for the blessing.
- Esau vows to kill Jacob after Isaac dies.
- Jacob gets the fuller blessing from Isaac and flees to Mesopotamia to find Rebekah's brother, maybe a wife.
- Jacob is homeless, penniless, without homeland, estranged from his father, chased by Esau.
- Jacob is fleeing, and one night has a vision of angels, a staircase and God.
- Makes a vow that if God provides, and protects, God will be Jacob's God.

- Stays with Laban for a month, more time with Rachel.
- Jacob agrees to 3x-4x price for 7 years of free work to get her.
- Laban and Leah deceive Jacob on honeymoon night.
 - Deceiver deceived. You harvest what you planted.

- In the morning, "Behold, it is Leah!"
- Jacob agrees to work 7 **more** years for free to get Rachel.

- Jacob prospers and now he is told it is time to go home.
- Jacob meets with his wives and discusses leaving.
- Jacob's wives (Laban's daughters) are done with Laban.
- Jacob, his family, his servants, his herds all leave in secret.
- Laban, 3 days behind pursues Jacob.
- God reveals to Laban to neither bless nor harm Jacob.
- Laban is furious: Jacob is deceitful in leaving and Jacob has stolen Laban's household gods.
- · Laban does not find them (daughter Rachel is hiding them.
- Jacob feels vindicated and unloads on how harshly he has been treated.
- Laban talks about his daughters, his grandchildren, his flocks. Jacob is done with Laban.
- Laban and Jacob make an agreement.

Principles and Applications

- Sometimes God uses broken relationships, and untenable circumstances to indicate a need for change.
- When God puts a Laban in our life; get curious:
 - Laban is demanding, conniving, deceptive, manipulative, and is not a man of faith!
 - Sometimes the obstacle is the way forward.
- All deceit is harmful.
- God uses circumstances to mold leaders.
- If at all possible, live at peace (especially with relatives).
 - "Blessed are the peacemakers, for they shall be called the children of God.
- Communicate with the other (not past the other).
