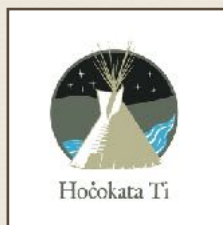
Front Row: Ida, Ole, Karen, Lena Back Row: Lewis, Rasmus, Julia, Olai, Bert.

One of many Dakota who are in Ernest Raymond Coursolle Jr. family tree are Angelique Agathe Winona Weouina Rxha Red Woman Renville Dupuis (1815-1890) and Hypolite Joseph Dupuis (1804-1879.) Fr. Augustin Ravoux recorded white and mixed blood Indians, and on September 8, 1842 they were married by a protestant minister at Petit Prairie (now Chaska) in presence of Ravoux.

Hypolite Joseph Dupuis, in *The Bench and Bar of Minnesota, Vol. 1* by Hiram F Stevens in 1904, noted that the first people who were enslaved were brought into Minnesota and held in servitude were of Col. Zachary Taylor, who was commander of the post about 1830, and subsequently a major general in the army, and president. In about 1838, an officer of the fort, sold a slave boy to Hypolite Dupuis, who held him a few months, and then sold him back to another officer. Mr. Dupuis, therefore, whatever of distinction attached to the first slave holding resident of Minnesota.

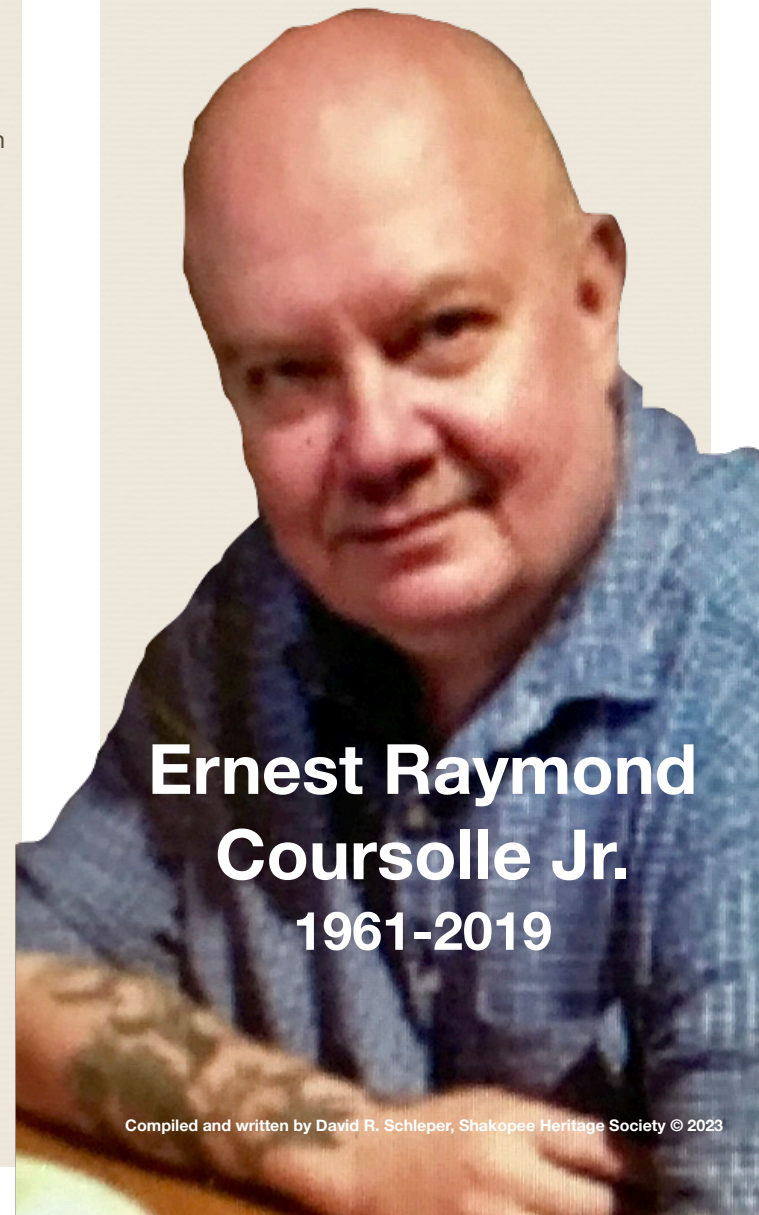
