In Shakopee 1955-1956

Mari Luz Palacios arrived in Shakopee, Minnesota on August 25, 1955. She was the first of many exchange students to visit Shakopee High School.

Mari Luz Palacois was from Madrid, Spain. When she arrived in Shakopee, she stayed with Dr. Bror Folke Pearson (1906-2004) and his wife, Elizabeth Stephens Pearson and their three daughters and one son. Dr. Pearson was a doctor in Shakopee for 42 years. In 1970 the B.F. Pearson Elementary School on 917 Dakota Street South was named after Dr. Pearson. In 2012 it was changed to Pearson Sixth Grade Center, and since 2020 it is
