Patrick's *Hunka* sisters were Barrie Lawrence, LeAnn Exum, Tawney Burrows, Katie Brewer, Jenny Brewer, Lizzie Bendel, Georgianna Drapeau, Grace Goldtooth, Danelle Grey Eagle, and Sarah Iron Cloud, and Patrick's *Hunka* brothers were Chaske LaBlanc, Glenford Drapeau, Dallas Goldtooth, Mike Rein, Jacob Melton, Reuben Crowfeather, Sr., Geno Barrientez, Anthony Barrientez, Matt Chuy Estrada, Phillip Steel, and Matt Pendleton.

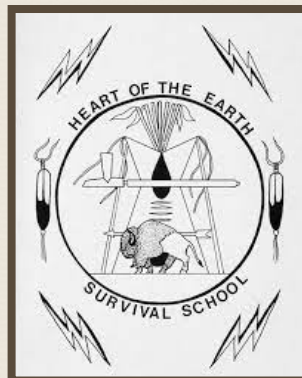

Patrick Leo Liéñleñya Máni Walks with Fire Foote, III started school at the Heart of the Earth Survival School in Minneapolis. It was a public school located in Dinky Town, and was set up by the members off the American Indian Movement.

The school focused on restoring the vanishing skills like hunting, fishing, wild rice gathering, maple syrup harvesting, and learning the Indigenous languages of Minnesota.

When Patrick was in 2nd grade, he moved to Shakopee and attended Shakopee Public Schools.

Patrick Leo Liéñleñya Máni Walks with Fire Foote, III was born on January 14, 1987, in St. Paul, Minnesota. His parents were Llwellyn Louie Foote and Georgette Garvin.

In his early years, Patrick Leo Liéñleñya Máni Walks with Fire Foote, III went to the Heart of the Earth Survival School.

Heart of the Earth Survival School was established in January 1972 by members of the American Indian Movement. According to Heart of the Earth Survival School at <https://www.mnopedia.org/group/heart-earth-survival-school>, the school was opened “in AIM’s Minneapolis office without a penny spent, the school was austere in the extreme. Students from that first class recall a basement classroom with a single bare lightbulb, cockroaches crawling on the walls, and a toilet that wouldn’t stop flushing. There was one old blackboard, a single piece of chalk, and one pencil for the students to share. What the school lacked in resources, it made up for in vision.

Unlike the public schools, which taught a Euro-centric perspective, Heart of the Earth’s vision included the restoration of vanishing knowledge like fishing and hunting skills, wild rice gathering, maple syrup harvesting, and Indigenous languages.”

When Patrick moved to Shakopee, he attended Shakopee public schools from 2nd through 10th grade.

Patrick loved listening to all kinds of music and he loved his Wacipi ceremonial music. He loved to cook, and hang out with his nieces and nephews.

Patrick was a kind loving person who had a heart of gold, and helped out when he was asked to and would never say no, even when he was not feeling good. He loved all his family members and his friends. He was funny, and always joking around, even through his illness.

Patrick Leo Liéñleñya Máni Walks with Fire Foote, III passed on to the Spirit World on May 10, 2020 due to congestive heart failure. He was 33 years old. Patrick was survived by his mother, Georgette Garvin; step-mother, LaVita Wells; sisters, Renelle Foote, Dacia (Leon) Lussier, Daneen Foote, and Alaina Foote; his brother, Garrett Garvin, among many others.

Patrick Leo Liéñleñya Máni Walks with Fire Foote, III also had *Hunka* mothers, *Hunka* brothers and *Hunka* sisters. The *Hunka* Ceremony is a ceremony when two people adopt the *Hunka* relationship toward each other, according to <https://www.sacred-texts.com/nam/pla/sdo/sdo34.htm>.

The *Hunka* relationship has existed among the Lakota and Dakota since ancient times. Once Shamans assumed control, adding rites until the ceremony assumed its present form. The most common designation of the ceremony is *They Waved Horse-tails over Each*
