Seasonal Safety Reminders

With Fall, comes additional lawn maintenance. Please make safety a priority.

The blowing of lawn clippings and leaves onto the roadway makes a hazard for motorists especially motorcyclists.

The burning of leaves, yard waste and newspapers is permitted Monday—Saturday from 6:00 a.m.— 8:00 p.m. and must be extinguished with no smoldering.

Please do not burn on any township road,

right-of-way or ditch line.



A competent adult and adequate water source must be present.

No burning on legal holidays or Sundays. Exceptions are cooking and recreational fires.

Prior to burning large

brush piles, contact the township and your local volunteer fire company.

Following leaf raking, comes the enjoyable time of year for snow shoveling and removal. Please do not push your snow onto the roadway.

To aid in safe winter travel especially during snow events, please do not park on the Township's right-of-way or road. This makes it very difficult for the road department to properly maintain the road.

Successful Road Project Season

It has been a very successful road project season.

The drainage for the Binsey Road Dirt, Gravel and Low Volume Grant project has been completed.

Bricker Avenue, Fallecker Road and a portion of Brinker Road were paved.

Future Road Projects

The drainage portion of the Bonniebrook Road grant project will be put out for bid in early 2020.

A Dirt, Gravel and Low Volume Grant application will be submitted for Stutz Road.

Kennedy Lane is scheduled for drainage and paving.

Public Sewage Update

The Board of Supervisors have designated the 2018 and 2019 Community Development Block Grant funding to assist low to moderate income individuals with the mandatory tap-in fee. Application are not available at this time. A notification will be sent to the individuals in the sewage service area detailing the process and the eligibility requirements.

A public meeting will be held within the next couple of months at the Herman Volunteer Fire Company social hall to present the service line area and plant design. When the meeting date has been established, it will be advertised in the Butler Eagle, posted on the fire company's marquee and Township's website.
