DISEASE PREVENTION REQUIREMENTS	STATUS <small>(to be completed by office staff)</small>
<p>Rabies: a fatal virus. Transmittable to man. Vaccine required by law every 3 years.</p> <p>Distemper: an enteric, respiratory, and neurologic virus. Transmitted from dog to dog and also wild canines. Vaccines can prevent disease for years. Part of a typical “Distemper” vaccine.</p> <p>Adenovirus Type I: a contagious virus that causes hepatitis in dogs and wild canines. Vaccines can prevent disease for years. Part of a typical “Distemper” vaccine or Adenovirus Type II vaccine.</p> <p>Adenovirus Type II: a contagious respiratory virus that can cause “kennel cough” in dogs. Vaccines provide protection but must be boosted yearly. Part of a typical 1-year “Distemper” vaccine.</p> <p>Parainfluenza: a highly contagious respiratory virus that causes “kennel cough” in dogs. Vaccines provide protection but must be boosted yearly. Part of a typical 1-year “Distemper” vaccine.</p> <p>Bordetella: a highly contagious respiratory pathogen of dogs. Prominent wherever dogs are in close contact such as shows, kennels, play groups, etc. A bacteria that is hard to vaccinate against. Boosters needed every 6 months, intranasally. Also known as canine cough/kennel cough.</p> <p>Canine Influenza: An upper respiratory disease. It is a highly contagious viral flu. Its peak shedding stage is day 1-5 post exposure, but dogs don’t show signs until the earliest day 3. This means there is ample time for the disease to spread without anyone even knowing.</p> <p>Vector-Borne Diseases: This includes heartworm, lyme, ehrlichiosis, and anaplasmosis. Must be done for any dog over 1 year old regardless of monthly preventative administration. Part of a typical “Heartworm” test.</p> <p>Fecal Exam: Screens for intestinal parasites. Intestinal parasites are spread through the stool and can persist in the environment. All dogs must have a negative fecal exam to play. Needed every 6 months.</p>
