GET YOUR KEY TO THE TENNIS COURTS

The tennis and portable pickleball nets are up unti Thanksgiving, and the courts are available first come, first serve (pun intended). Contact our tennis chairman Tony Trent (1525 Brook Mill Ct., text: 317.945.5656) for a key to enjoy this valuable amenity (a \$10 deposit is required.)

The courts were resurfaced in 2019 and new LED lights were added after a major capital invest-

ment by the Springmill Crossing Property Owners Association. Last year, the yellow lines for pickelball were layered over the white tennis lines on one court.

The lighting timers are located outside the fence to enable late-night games. Enjoy the courts, but be sure to clean up before you leave and lock the gate securely behind you.

NO TRAILERS, BOATS...




REMINDERS

GET A YARD LIGHT

One of the specifics mentioned in our Convenents is ensuring you always have an installed, dusk-to-dawn yard light in your front yard. If you have no yard light or one that needs to be replaced or repaired, the Development Control Committee asks that would work to rectify this. If for some reason this is not feasible, please let us know.

PAINT YOUR POST

For those of you who did not replace your mailbox and post this year, now is a great time to apply car wax to the painted metal box or to spray a clear coat to refresh the paint. Even more important, a lot of mailbox posts are showing wear and tear and are in desperate need for repainting with flat black paint. Thanks for your help in this effort to keep Springmill Crossing from looking its age.





- Emerald Ash Borer Treatment
- Insects and disease control (insects can be especially bad due to mild winter temperatures)
- Quality pruning of shade and ornamental trees and shrubs by certified arborists.
- Tree and stump removal.
- Two-year deep root organic fertilization of trees and shrubs (mild winter and then frosts will damage trees that have leafed prematurely and therefore will need fertilization and perhaps micronutrients)
- Scale treatment
- Complete lawn care (except mowing). Six-application program plus grub control.
- Senior citizen discount for tree removals and trimming (5 percent up to \$100)
