We are still waiting to hear from Garry Getz to see if he is able to come to our Spring show.



## **Tucson Gem Show 2023 from Becky:**

If you have an opportunity to experience the Tucson Gem Show I hope you will. I am very proud of our Gemboree but it is just a fraction of what you will find in Tucson. Every year about 65,000 people from all over the world descend on the area. This show is a rock hounds dreams come true.

This is the 3rd time I have attended and it was a little easier to navigate. The entire city is taken over with shows in the Convention and Conference Centers, hotels, Sporting Complex, parking lots, etc. providing a place for venders to show their wares. One must do some research and see what shows interest you the most and where the dealers are that you want to see. There are wholesale shows for the venders and shows open to the public.

The Main Show is the Tucson Gem and Mineral Show put on by the Tucson Gem and Mineral Society. This is the "largest, oldest and most prestigious gem and mineral show in the world". It has had international status since the 1970's. The theme for this 68th show was 'Silica – Agates, Opals and Quartz, Oh My!' Where we have 32 venders they have 250. The display cases were jaw dropping – set up by people from all over the world. They had programs and lectures throughout the weekend. It was very impressive.

The 1st show we attended was the last day of The Pueblo Gem and Mineral Show. The show was located at the Ramada Tucson Conference Center in downtown Tucson along Interstate 10. This show is open to the public.

The next day we met up with friends and a group of Canadian jewelers and went to the Kino Sports Complex. This show had nearly tripled in size since we were last there (pre pandemic). We met with David Rich who was hanging with his friends Debbie and Ron from Larimar – who you may know as one of our Gemboree Venders.

The last day we went to the Mineral and Fossil Co-op – a favorite from a previous visit. There were full size bones of dinosaurs among other treats. There was an area set up by Coleman Mines from Arkansas fame!

Then for the icing on the cake we met up with Laurie and Paul McElroy for a day trip to the Chiricahua Mountains, Bisbee, Lowell and Tombstone, but never made it to Quartzite □.
