# And here are the Bench Tips for next month.

#### ANNEALING THIN WIRE

Annealing thin wire can be tricky. For a good anneal, all areas of the wire must be heated uniformly to just barely red before quenching in water. If you're heating with a torch, the tricky part is how to get every inch of the wire up to the same proper annealing temp without melting any of it.

The first thing I do to avoid problems is to wind the wire into a tight coil about two inches in diameter and bind it together in several places with scrap wire. Any stray loops or loose ends will heat up very quickly and possibly melt before the more bulky coil reaches the annealing temperature. Annealing fine wire with a torch is always risky.

A perfect anneal with no risk of melting is easy if you have an enameling or casting oven. Heat to about 1200 F, place the coil of wire into the oven, let it soak for 5 minutes, and quench.

But for those with no oven, here's how I use a scrap of thick sheet metal and an old tuna fish can to build my own "oven" and avoid melting delicate items when annealing.


- 1. Elevate the sheet on a tripod or a couple fire bricks at your solder station so you can heat it with a torch from below.
- 2. Place the coil onto the sheet and elevate it with a couple pieces of steel or broken solder pad so the silver wire does not touch the plate. An old bur shaft or a nail works nicely.
- 3. Cover the wire coil with a metal can similar to what tuna fish comes in.
- 4. Heat from the bottom and hold at the annealing temperature for several minutes before quenching.

Avoid getting the sheet metal red hot. One easy way to gauge the proper annealing temperature inside the can is to use a black marker on the outside as shown. Another is to put a dab of paste

flux on the sheet metal plate. The marker will disappear, or the flux will melt when the can reaches the proper annealing temperature.

And BTW, the wire coil I'm annealing here is filigree wire that I'm making up for a workshop I'll be teaching this July in Culver City, CA at the Fiesta of Gems Show. For more information on the classes there, see https://culvercityrocks.org/fiesta/

Here's the coil of wire bound tightly and sitting on the metal plate. Note that if the coil touches the plate, I had it get too hot once and bond to it. So, I now elevate the coil on a couple of steel nails, old bur shafts or pieces of broken solder pad.



This shows a black Magic Marker being used to give an indication of the temperature inside the can as the makeshift oven is heated up to temperature.
