### **Gemboree news from Mary Myers:**

**The biggest news is this:** Emidio's Expo Center is probably/possibly/likely going to change the floor space that will be available in the future. (Can you tell that it's all up in the air right now?) Pellegrino has promised to keep me informed of the changes. He expects that our April show will **not** be affected (but please keep your fingers crossed). And yes, of course, we have a contract (through our October 2024 show), but the Expo Center is a business and Pellegrino obviously has to make decisions that best serve his purposes.

Our October show <u>will</u> likely be affected by these changes. Pellegrino expects to know more by May and he will inform us then. Construction inside the Center to wall off a portion of the floor space will likely begin sometime (hopefully) after our April show. We can put our stuff away after the April show, but we will likely lose our storage space sometime after May so that he can prepare the Expo Center for show over the summer and for our show.
