

• Advanced members; members with three years or more must have two stones in the design with at least one cut by you.

- 3rd place is one year free membership to the club.

When you turn in your piece(s) state which category you are in and what stones you used. Label your piece(s) with your name on the back with sticky tape. Put your entry in a zip bag.

Dave Macseoinin and Donnell got the second arbor press while Susie Shoffner and I went out to

Medina to Standard Welding to get the blades made for the second cracker. Laura McElroy is working on getting the new square and internet connection we'll need for that new geode station. Bob Powers is working on the postcards. Gene Willis is working on the admittance tickets and has finished the repair on our crystal display (wait 'till you see it - it's absolutely stunning!!!). John Wallace is working on a light table for the silent auction (to better display beautiful agates for sale). Becky, Dave, Kathi, and others are working on slabbing for our new slab table. Debbie Matczyszyn (and many other members) have been working on making the gem tree kits for the Children's Craft table. Cathy Milhoan has been helping me with tons of minutia that I have asked of her. Kim Evangelisti and I have been working on the Sign Up Genius listing. Bill Maki got us a QR code to post near the admissions table that will collect the contact information of those who are digitally savvy. The list goes on and on. So many members have been pulling together to make this Gemboree successful! Thank you to all, and especially to all whom I have forgotten to mention here. Please forgive me.

<u>Gemboree meetings</u>: I am holding a Gemboree meeting every 2nd Tuesday at 6:15pm, at the Polish American Club (before the Summit Lapidary Clubs general membership Meeting).
