

Keep in mind everyone's heat presses are different, so use this as a guide/starting point and play around until you find what works best for you. This film is a hot or cold peel. We have found the cold to be fool proof, especially on intricate designs so tend to do mostly as a cold peel.

Cold Peel:

300 degrees, medium to heavy pressure, pre-press garment 5 seconds, apply DTF press 10 seconds, peel when completely cold, repress with a teflon** sheet for 10 seconds.

Hot Peel:

300 degrees, medium to heavy pressure, pre-press garment 5 seconds, apply DTF press 10 seconds, rub with a cloth for a few seconds, then hot peel*, repress with a teflon** sheet for 10 seconds.

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**I ordered the Tseal cover sheet and it seems to "seal' the DTF into the fabric. I have no affiliation with the company nor get anything in return for recommending it. I still use the teflon sheet depending on the look we are trying to achieve.
