RHINOS IN CRISIS

Rhinos. One of the world's oldest living mammals. Today's rhinos are the descendants of the largest mammal to ever walk the earth, and that roamed our planet over 40 million years ago. Immediately recognizable and iconic though maybe not as high profile as elephants, they are equally imposing, charismatic and irreplaceable.

Their role in the ecosystem is unsurpassed. Rhinos are nature's environmental engineers. They don't just shape the landscape. They change it in ways that ensure the survival of countless other species.

Their survival is under threat. Climate change and habitat degradation have significantly contributed to their decline. More recently, consumer demand, almost exclusive to Asian countries, for rhino horn has pushed rhinos towards extinction.

Rhino horn was a staple for centuries. In addition to serving as a status symbol, medicinal tool, and practical item, horns are also traded as investments, scarcity driving up their value. Today rhino horn is considered to be among the most valuable commodities in the world. The value of rhino horn per gram exceeds that of gold, diamonds, heroin, and cocaine.

International trade in horn has been prohibited since 1977 by the Convention on International Trade in Endangered Species of Wild Fauna and Flora (CITES), but illegal trade continues to thrive. In addition to being a low-risk and high-reward activity, rhino horn trafficking is intimately linked to other organised crimes and terrorist groups. Despite rhino poaching being geographically limited, its effects can be felt by all.
