The Chief Joe Mathias BC Aboriginal Scholarship Fund was established to honour the memory of the late Chief Joe Mathias, a hereditary and elected Chief of the Squamish Nation. Chief Mathias is remembered for his vision and his leadership for the rights of aboriginal people in British Columbia and across the country. Central to that vision was his passionate belief in and advocacy for higher education for aboriginal young people. This Scholarship Fund is dedicated to helping realize Joe's dream of providing post-secondary opportunities for energetic, dedicated and aspiring young British Columbia First Nation students, and providing them the opportunities to enable them to realize their dreams of becoming leaders of tomorrow in the career of their choosing. There is no more appropriate tribute to the work of Chief Mathias than to witness the success of the young First Nations graduates and scholarship recipients presented here. First Nation doctors, businesspeople, scientists, social workers, engineers, nurses, computer programmers, lawyers, and teachers...these are the leaders of the future who will continue his legacy and ensure a bright and prosperous future for First Nations citizens and their communities.

The Chief Joe Mathias Scholarship has provided over 480 scholarships to over 330 students from over 100 First Nations in BC since its inception in 2002.

STATEMENT OF ACTIVITIES

The Chief Joe Mathias British Columbia Aboriginal Scholarship Fund ("The Fund") is a nationally registered charity established in memory of the late Chief Joe Mathias to support Chief Mathias' vision of post-secondary education for all First Nations people. The Fund is an incorporated society under the Society Act of British Columbia.

The purposes of the Fund is to advance education by providing educational scholarships to deserving British Columbia First Nation students who are in financial need and who demonstrate merit, in order to improve access to post-secondary education so that deserving British Columbia First Nation people can acquire the knowledge and skills needed to participate in a changing economy and society, including scholarships to enable deserving BC First Nation students to engage in:

- Courses of study towards an academic degree or diploma, at an eligible post-secondary educational institution at an undergraduate level; or
- Post-graduate academic studies at an eligible post-secondary educational institution

ELIGIBLE RECIPIENTS

The Fund will grant scholarships only to people who:

- Are members or citizens of a British Columbia First Nation;
- Are enrolled at an eligible post-secondary educational institution as a full-time, or part-time, student;
- Are pursuing studies that lead to a degree, or diploma from that institution; and
- Are in financial need and demonstrate merit.

Priority will be given to candidates who wish to pursue and excel in academic pursuits with the greatest potential benefit to the welfare and advancement of First Nations peoples and communities.

The Fund will NOT grant scholarships for the following:

- A. Education at non-recognized post-secondary institutions;
- B. Attendance at conferences / symposiums / workshops; and
- C. Professional fees / schools.

ELIGIBLE POST-SECONDARY EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTION

The scholarships will be provided to eligible recipients for post-secondary studies at a post-secondary educational institution that grants degrees or diplomas.

ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS

□ Factors to be considered by the Board in the selection of a candidate for a scholarship may include academic achievement, personal qualities and character, interest and participation in post-secondary educational institution and community affairs, development of a program of studies and special aptitude and qualification for that program.

APPLICATIONS

Applications will be reviewed each year at a special meeting of the Board held for the purpose of awarding Scholarships. Scholarship Applications must conform with all requirements of the following application Form. Should you have any questions please email chiefjoemathias@gmail.com.
